Knowing What We Need To Know

"The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction." Proverbs 1:7

We live in a world full of uncertainty and things that are unknown. To a person, we have all asked the questions, "why?", "what?", "when?", "where?", "how?" The desire to learn and to know are inherent parts of our being. Yet, there are times when we desire to know that which is not intended for us (e.g. -Acts 1:7). The list of things that we desire to know is endless. What will tomorrow bring? How will current events turn out? What is in store for the future? Many spend countless hours of study in search of knowledge that has no lasting benefit.

The great tragedy is that for all that man is obsessed with the search for knowledge, he often ignores the things that we need to know most. Ironically, the things that we need to know most are offered to us freely in Christ Jesus – 2 Peter 1:3 "According as His divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness. through the knowledge of Him that hath called us to glory and virtue:"

King Solomon, the wisest man ever, appreciated that academic excellence is not paramount. His declaration in *Proverbs 1:7* informs us that reverence (regard, respect) for the Lord is the beginning (chief part) of knowledge. From these words of wisdom, we may determine that the one that does not know God, despite what other knowledge may be possessed, for all intents and purposes, knows nothing. The kind of knowledge of which Solomon wrote goes beyond academic accomplishments to moral responsibility. Academic pursuit is fine its place. A good understanding of current affairs is beneficial in some regard. However, there is a knowledge far superior to these. The knowledge of God's word and will is supreme. The Master Himself has declared – Luke 11:28 "... Yea rather, blessed are they that hear the word of God, and keep it."

Many are the opportunities afforded to us each day to learn the things that we need to know. We have the promise of the Master that if we seek, we shall find – *Matthew 7:7-8*. To God be the glory! Amen!
