How Do You See Yourself?

"There also we saw the Nephilim (the sons of Anak are part of the Nephilim); and we became like grasshoppers in our own sight, and so we were in their sight." Numbers 13:33

It is interesting to note that others quite often see us in a different light than we see ourselves. Moreover, the way we see ourselves often affects the way that others see us. In the above referenced passage of scripture, Israel's fear of the inhabitants of the land is clear. They viewed themselves as being an insignificant people that could in no wise stand against giants. Yet, as God led them in the subduing of the Promised Land, we learn that the inhabitants of the land came to see Israel as anything but grasshoppers – *Joshua 2:9-11*.

Israel, at least for a time, was afflicted with "Grasshopper Complex." Their thinking was fundamentally flawed. They did not consider that they were a nation led by the great God of heaven. They gave consideration only to their own strength. Little wonder then that they saw themselves as grasshoppers. Yet, the more pressing concern is "how do we see ourselves?"

Every member of the Lord's church, in God's eyes, has a vital part in the plan of God – *Ephesians 4:11-16*. God gifts each one of us with different talents, opportunities and circumstances. We are uniquely suited, each one of us, and empowered by the great God of heaven to serve in His kingdom. When we see ourselves as insignificant and our contributions as unimportant, like Israel, we have taken our focus off the One who has called us to serve. Undoubtedly the apostle Paul had these things in mind when he spoke the great exhortation – *Colossians 3:17 "Whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father."* We can face each day, each challenge, each trial with the calming, God-confident assurance that is grounded in our faith in Him and the understanding of our value to Him. In this way we will live lives that honor and glorify God – *Matthew 5:16*. To God be the glory! Amen!
