Jesus healed this man in two stages, moving from the partial to complete. None of the other recorded miracles have this characteristic. This begs to question, "Why did Jesus work this miracle in this fashion?" He could have healed this man with one word. Yet, He chose to heal him in two steps instead of one. The reason for Jesus' action is not stated in the text. However, there are some things that demand to be noticed about Jesus' actions in this event.

Jesus took a personal interest in this blind man (v.23). Considering that the people often came to Him in droves, this, in and of itself, is noticeable. Furthermore, Jesus asked him a noteworthy question. Effectively, "Do you see anything?" The man's response indicates that while he could now see, his vision was somewhat distorted. After a second touch, the man's sight was totally restored.

This account is really a lesson on how God, as a matter of grace and mercy, deals with us. It is interesting that this account of physical blindness, follows on the heels of the disciples' spiritual blindness (Mark 8:14-21). When we look at the world around us, our lives, our circumstances, what do we see? The apostle Paul has declared, "For we walk by faith, not by sight." 2 Corinthians 5:7. This statement is indicative of the nature of the Christian walk. Yet, we do not always see things through the eves of faith. It may be said that at times we see life in the same way this man saw people after the first touch.

However, the love of God moves Him to guide us through life and bring us to a better, more complete understanding by degrees. May we learn to daily trust God's faithfulness, and daily be thankful for His providence as He heals us. To God be the glory! Amen.
