"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." John 10:10

Someone has made the observation that with our technological advances "...we have added years to living, but not living to life." This statement is worthy of consideration and begs to question, "Why is this the case?" Any question about life is best answered by the One from whom life comes – God. It is clear from this declaration of the Master that He intends for us to live life "drinking from the saucer." (Psalm 23:5).

One doesn't get the impression from reading the Philippian epistle that Paul was imprisoned in Rome at the time he wrote this letter. Yet, we know this to be the case (*Philippians 1:7*). The tenor of the letter is so positive and encouraging that one would think that Paul was relatively carefree at the time he wrote it. It is a letter filled with comfort and hope. Paul was experiencing the blessings that come from positive living in Christ.

When giving thought to the idea of positive living in Christ someone has stated, "Things are the way they are without, because things are the way they are within." How are you living? Is your life full of joy? Do you walk with pep in your step or a sag in your shoulders? Jesus declares that He gives us life abundantly (John 10:10). Therefore, Christians should lead positive lives. Positive living is not:

Positive living is a decision (commitment) to live by faith in God. The promises of God are many and true each one (e.g. – Matthew 6:33, John 16:33, etc.). Yet, none of these promises are experienced in the absence of faith. We must do more than say that God is true. We must live lives that agree with our profession. To God be the glory! Amen!
