Have You Seen Yourself Lately?

"Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you are disqualified." 2 Corinthians 13:5

From a physical perspective, we are more readily aware of what others look like because seeing others requires no special use of our vision. However, seeing my own physical appearance requires the use of a mirror or some other reflective means. Even then our view is usually limited to a frontal perspective. Others see us from different angles and postures all the time. Have you ever had someone adjust your collar or indicate that you had something on your face that needed to be wiped off? Usually when this happens, we are unaware of the needed fix.

Seeing ourselves from a spiritual perspective can have impediments as well (e.g. – pride, stubbornness, arrogance, etc.). The apostle Paul exhorted the Corinthian Christians to take a good look at themselves from a spiritual perspective. A good look often reveals things that are missed with a cursory glance. A good spiritual once over is only accomplished by measuring myself (not others) by the word of God. God has blessed us all to grow to be more than we were. Yet, none of us are finished products. Regarding this fact will help us to be more compassionate of the lack that may exist in others and be more desirous to help rather than to castigate.

Moreover, let us be thankful to God for His grace and mercy that has and continues to spare us while we devote ourselves to becoming the people He would have us to be. We are saved by grace – *Ephesians 2:5, 8*. To God be the glory! Amen!
