A Constant Audience

“And whatever you do in word or deed, *do* all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.” *Colossians 3:17*

In our present culture one never knows just who is watching. The proliferation of smart phones has led to many videos going viral on social media. Quite often the subjects of these videos had no idea they were being watched in the first place. In such cases and given a second chance one wonders how many of these individuals would make different choices.

As God's children does the fact that someone may be watching call for a change in our behavior? Someone has defined “integrity” as “the person you are when you think no one is watching.” Is there ever truly such a time? The Bible declares, *Proverbs 15:3* “The eyes of the LORD *are* in every place, Keeping watch on the evil and the good.”
