Be All That You Can Be “Do not neglect the gift that is in you, which was given to you by prophecy with the laying on of the hands of the eldership.” <i>1 Timothy 4:14</i> An important consideration for every child of God is to examine self to better understand oneself to the end that we might better discern what our gifts (abilities) are and how we may use them in God’s service. As members of the family of God, we have each been called and equipped for service – <i>Ephesians 2:10</i> “For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.” The gifts that we possess have been given to us by God to be used for God. Using our individual gifts to this end is good stewardship – <i>1 Peter 4:10</i> “As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.” Working in God’s service is a mandate. However, it is also a choice. We must choose to be used. There must be a willingness to serve before we can serve. Surely, we are all aware of the danger of being idle as was the servant that received one talent (<i>Matthew 25:14ff</i>). As was once said, “<i>Don’t quit on being who God has called you to be.</i>” No one can do everything, but we all can do something. Each part of the body plays a significant and important role in the well-being of the whole (<i>1 Corinthians 12</i>).
