How Do You Read It?

"He said to him, "What is written in the law? What is your reading of it?" Luke 10:26

The verse from the Bible referenced above was Jesus' reply to a question posed to him by an expert in the law of Moses. His motives were not honorable, but his question was scriptural. In trying to trap Jesus, this lawyer became tangled in his own net. The exchange between Jesus and the lawyer imparts to us that it is necessary to know the word of God. It further imparts to us that just knowing what the Bible teaches is insufficient. The word of God is likened unto a seed – *Luke 8:11* "Now the parable is this: The seed is the word of God." This seed bears fruit when it is sown in an honest and open heart – *Luke 8:15* "But the ones *that* fell on the good ground are those who, having heard the word with a noble and good heart, keep it and bear fruit with patience."

The lawyer in the exchange recorded in Luke 10 certainly possessed intellectual knowledge of the word of God. He was able to answer Jesus' question (Luke 10:27). Jesus acknowledged that the lawyer had answered his question correctly (Luke 10:28). Yet, the rest of the exchange declares that the lawyer lacked a proper regard for the very thing in which he thought he trusted. He knew the law (intellectually). However, he lacked the proper regard for it.

Introspectively, we need to ask ourselves the same question that Jesus asked the lawyer. "How do you read it?" Do we read it as fiction, suggestion, or as God's revelation? Do we read it as a matter of obligation or devotion? The Bible is the word of God - 2 Timothy 3:16 "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness." The Bible must be read with the intellectual acknowledgment that it is true. Beyond this, it must be read with a heart of submission and a willingness to obey (i.e. - in the manner of the Bereans – *Acts 17:11*). It is in the word of God that we find all that we need to navigate the sojourn called "life" – 2 Peter 1:3"as His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glorv and virtue." To God be the glory! Amen!
