# "How" Matters to Him

"that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world," Philippians 2:15

It is not uncommon, nor surprising, to hear someone relate an experience in "customer service" that was less than positive. It seems that there is no shortage of disgruntled workers in our society. What is more alarming is that poor attitude and/or poor performance are not always grounds for dismissal in the secular world.

However, this is not the case in God's kingdom. If God is to be pleased with us, both our attitudes and our actions must be right in His sight. For this reason the apostle exhorted the Philippian Christians to serve without causing offense. As citizens of God's kingdom we are also representatives of His name. Our attitudes and actions reflect on our Father (either favorably or adversely). It was for this very reason that the Roman Christians were commanded, Romans 12:17 "Repay no one evil for evil. *Have regard for good things in* the sight of all men." (emphasis mine)

When a worker dons a uniform he becomes a representative for the company that owns the uniform. The job done by the worker becomes the company's reputation. This same principle holds true in the spiritual context. When one obeys the gospel and begins to profess the name of Christ, that one becomes His representative. This being true, it is no wonder that we are called to be "blameless and harmless" and to "shine as lights in the world." We are to serve without causing offense.

The story is told of a father who welcomed his son into his business. The father gave the son a shirt with the family name embroidered on the back. Pointing to the family name the father told the son, "Remember, that's my name too." The meaning is clear. We would do well to remember that as Christians, it is His name we represent. To God be the glory! Amen!
