Neglecting Salvation

"how shall we escape if we neglect so great a salvation, which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed to us by those who heard *Him*" *Hebrews 2:3*

Salvation is used in different contexts in the Bible. For example, at times it is used to refer to the deliverance from the power and effects of past sins (e.g. $-Mark\ 16:16$). It is also used to refer to eternal salvation in heaven (e.g. $-1\ Peter\ 1:5;\ Philippians\ 2:12$). The exhortation of the Hebrew writer makes it clear that salvation can be neglected. "Neglect" means a lack of sufficient attention. "Neglect" is not rebellion, but indifference.

Men may neglect salvation for many different reasons, but never to good purpose. Some neglect salvation because they allow themselves to be deluded into thinking that there will be time to think of it later (*James 4:13-14*). Some neglect salvation because they are waiting for a "convenient season", a time when it will be easier to obey the Lord (*Acts 24:25; 2 Corinthians 6:2*). Many neglect salvation because they have burdened themselves with the cares of this life (*Luke 14:16-20*).

Whatever the reason may be the dangers are the same. Neglecting salvation ultimately leads to one being hardened by $\sin - Hebrews$ 3:12 "Beware, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God;" One's heart can become so hard that one cannot be renewed to repentance – Hebrews 6:4-6. Neglecting salvation will also subject one to the wrath of God – Hebrews 10:26-31. May God bless us to be good stewards of His grace and to work out our salvation with fear and trembling (Philippians 2:12). To God be the glory! Amen.
