Highlights From March Board Meeting:

- Youth director has been hired. We took time to introduce ourselves to Kaleigh.
- There continue to be remodels done to the Chapel, which is the Heritage Room, and the Library. Pictures are being hung, and the cabinet from the entry way has been moved to the Heritage Room.
- Matt Rusche reported that we have signed a letter of acceptance of the bid of \$55,295.00 from Fred's, and they have us on their list to install, maybe as soon as April. He also reported that Fred's has been here to fix the boiler again, said that another inner heat exchanger will need to be replaced. The ceiling tiles in the gym were discussed. Mike will have M & D bring the scaffolding and we will replace them at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday April 13. Mike will make sure the clips will be here.
- As required by the bylaws an annual review is being done. Article 1 of Bylaws requires no changes. Article 2 it is suggested we change the vision statement. We will work with what Pastor proposed and come back to the April meeting to firm it up. It was noted that we will change the title of 1. b to Mission Statement and then start a new paragraph with "Naturally..." and call this "c. Mission of Faith Community" and then what was 1. c will become 1. d. We are also recommending changing the wording in Article 2, 2. b. Salvation by inserting the words in sentence two to include "repenting and" so the second sentence will read, "Only by **repenting and** trusting in Jesus Christ as God's offer of forgiveness can anyone be saved from sin's penalty." We also are recommending a change in wording in Article 2 section C 2. Communion e. Who can take Communion iii. By striking required and inserting "expected" so the second sentence would read, "It is **expected** that the child has…" We then agreed that we will work the vision statement and Article 3 at our April meeting.
- We had a very successful clean up day with 12 junior high youth joining around 15 adults to deep clean several closets, and carry out many books and chairs etc... We carried some items to the garage to be placed on the City Wide garage sale in April 25 27. We need some people to organize and run the garage sale.
- Staffing plans going forward. It was decided to separate the "Summer Lunch" coordinator from the Children's Ministry Coordinator's job description. Since the Summer Lunch is required soon, we will focus on hiring someone to coordinate. Salary of \$6,000 for the summer, Lunches start on May 28 and end August 16. If no one is found by early May, we will cancel Summer Lunch.
- We do want to hire a Children's Ministry coordinator to handle other duties of the coordinator we had. Until one is found and hired, the education committee will focus on Sunday School and VBS. It was discussed putting it on hold for a year and covering it with volunteers, and possibly asking Rosa to take on the printing of the curriculum, etc... We will use "Handshake" to hire again, if we do not get any applicants from within the church for the positions.
- Treasures Report: We have \$39,273.78 in checking, \$67,967.86 in Ultra Savings, and \$50,000 CD for a total of \$157,241.64 Expenses for February were \$30,150.04 with an income for February of \$23,253.79 for net loss of \$6,896.25 for the month of February. We have \$53,089.78 in our capital expenditure fund, and another \$5,000 came in already in March. These funds will be used for the air conditioning.
