Pastoral Search Team

On November 9th, the Pastoral Search Team met between services. On the agenda we reviewed the survey discussed the church profile and discussed filling the pulpit. We had 70 people who completed the survey. We ranged from under 18 to 65+. The surveys were split evenly between male and female. The top three responses to each question are shown below.

 - c. Spiritual leadership
- 2. What are the ministry gifts that are especially important for our next pastor to possess?
 - a. Strong biblical preaching
 - b. Relational warmth
 - c. Visionary leadership
- 3. Which ministries are the most important in our congregation?
 - a. Nurture faith in children and youth
 - b. Strengthen families
 - c. Connect the church with the wider community
- 4. How can our church be a more integral part of our community
 - a. Deepen community connection through visible service, family engagement, and partnership
 - b. Maintain a welcoming and outward-focused spirit
 - c. Welcoming, inclusive church

A takeaway from the many comments from the survey: Members value ministries that deepen discipleship, strengthen care and connection and expand outreach-but also recognize that revitalization, participation, and shared leadership will be key to success. We are in the process of completing our church profile (like a resume) and plan on getting it posted to job placement websites, seminaries, and other site. It has been a lot of work, but we think it is a good product, that will further our pastoral search. Filling the pulpit is a priority at this point. We are connecting with pastors who are willing to preach one Sunday each month for the next six months. We believe this will create some consistency for the church. If anyone knows of a pastor or lay person who would be a candidate to fill this need, please let someone on the Pastoral Search Team know. If you feel a calling to tell your story we encourage you to approach the team. We will always work with you to make sure you are comfortable with your decision.
