# Avent and Christmas at Hope Our Dear Christ Enters In

And if we did that, how does his entry into the world speak into, and even change, our approach to this season?

#### **Hope for the Homeless-Providence Connects**



Thank you for your continued support of Providence Connects. October and November were paired together. The first Thrivent card purchased a total of 90 pairs of men's underwear as there was an extreme clearance for sizes small, 2xl and 3xl. A total of



\$280 worth of 15 packs of 6 count boxers for \$39 and 107 men's and women's deodorants were purchased for a total of \$228.23. In addition, there were 3 XL body wash bottles, 3 toothbrush kits, 10 combs and 4 hair scrunchies donated by 4 Hope members. The card was used to purchase 55 lightweight fleece blankets for the homeless population of Melbourne the be distributed via Providence Connects- previously known as Daily Bread. A total of \$232.10 was used for the 55 blankets. There were 2 hours spent making a list, shopping, sorting and dropping off items to the designated drop-off warehouse. In addition, there were 10 packages of 10 count hand warmers, 1 xl box of Band-Aid and 4 deodorants donated by 3 Hope members.
