# **WEEK ONE: MEDICAL EMERGENCIES** by Jessie Black

A medical emergency can happen anywhere, anytime, without warning. A car accident, a heart attack, a fall, a stroke, and choking are just a few examples. Some of these can be fatal if not treated right away. Are you able to recognize the warning signs of a stroke or heart attack? Can you assist someone who is choking? Do you know how to use an Automated External Defibrillator (AED)? Do you know what to do to stop severe bleeding, immobilize an injured arm or leg, or simply provide comfort and reassurances to an injured person while waiting for professional aid?

A one-day class in CPR and First Aid could help you gain the confidence to come to someone's aid in the event of a medical emergency and possibly save a life. Last year, I received a call from a student in my Wilderness First Aid class. He shared that knowledge and skills he gained from the class enabled him to confidently assist a women at a grocery store that had suffered a heart attack. Whether hiking in the mountains or shopping at the local grocery, knowing what to do can mean the difference between life and death.

Every home, car, workplace, or place of gathering should have a first aid kit. Do you have one? What's in your kit? The easy items include elastic bandages, antibiotic cream, antiseptic wipes, aspirin, etc. but a good kit will also have gloves, a CPR pocket mask, tweezers, cotton swabs, burn cream, gauze pads, roller bandages and at least one triangular bandage. The more comprehensive kits will also include scissors, thermometers, cold packs, a variety of dressings and some simple splints. For higher risk environments, kits may have tourniquets, eye washes, and items more specific to the types of hazards for that location.

Next Saturday, The Met is hosting an Adult & Pediatric CPR/AED and First Aid class. Check with **Jessie Black** to see if there's still room to reserve a seat. This Sunday, Jessie will have a display of her recommended first aid kits for backpacks, home, car, and church.

CPR/First Aid Class: Saturday, June 12, 8 AM - 5 PM \$50 for Red Cross Certification; \$15 for everyone else.
