The Good Shepherd

I hope you are engaging with our series, "Outrageous Claims." This month we continue with four more of Jesus claims (see below), or his "I am" statements, all leading up to Easter and his claim, "I am the resurrection and the life." I hope you will see that Jesus claims lead to power lessons for our lives.

Among the claims of Jesus are his claims, "I am the Good Shepherd," and "I am the Gate for the sheep."

In 2021, a sheep named Baarack received a muchneeded shearing after rescuers in Australia found the abandoned animal with more than 75 pounds of wool weighing it down. A video of his transformation on TikTok had millions and millions of views. After rescuing Baarack, the staff of an animal sanctuary gave him the longoverdue shearing and found the fleece clocked in at about 78 pounds.

In a story by USA Today, Kelly Dinham, with Edgar's Mission Farm Sanctuary, said that sheep need at least yearly shearing to keep their coats light enough for the animals, otherwise it will continue to grow. Baarack's wool was heavy, impaired his vision and was full of grit and debris.

Well, he survived and was nurtured back to

health. It turns out that to be a sheep without a shepherd can be quite a problem.

We need a shepherd. In our day, however, there aren't a lot of them around, so we don't understand them well. Timothy Laniak in his book, "While Shepherds Watched Their Flocks" talks about three key responsibilities of a Shepherd—provision (getting them to food and drink), protection (keeping them from being eaten or stolen) and guidance (getting them to where they need to go.)



The gospel of John tells us that Jesus in our Good Shepherd who provides, protects and guides us—the sheep of his pasture. We need to be under the care of our Shepherd, otherwise we can wander off or be attacked. We need a Shepherd who, through his loving care, walks with us to peaceful streams and quiet pastures.

LIGHT

While preparing for a message about Jesus' statement "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12, NIV), I found a lot of information and commentary about the contrast between dark and light. Such as, the world is full of sin and darkness, so we need to live according to his light. Or God lights our path. Or Isaiah prophetically speaking about the birth of Jesus saying, people living in darkness have seen a great light. Most of what I found boiled down to "The world is dark; Christ is light; so follow Jesus!"

However, when it comes to light, there is much, much more than just a binary contrast between light and dark because light has many more purposes than just illuminating a dark place. Lights are used for guidance by pointing us in a certain direction or toward safety, like a lighthouse in a storm. During a live performance, a spotlight emphasizes or highlights a certain actor when giving a monologue, or a particular musician playing a solo. Lights also help portray or enhance emotions and moods using color or intensity, such as red, yellow and orange to convey warmth or alert us to danger, or cool colors like blue, green or purple to convey

calmness or indicate sadness. When you're feeling down, they don't call them "the blues" for nothing.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people, "You are the light of the world ... let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven (Matthew 5:14, 16, NIV). And in Ephesians 5, Paul says "For once you were full of darkness, but now you have light from the Lord. So live as people of light! For this light within you produces only what is good and right and true" (Ephesians 5:8-9, NLT).

So if we are going to be light, then we should understand the purposes of light — to guide people toward Christ, to emphasize our faith in him, and to change the mood of situations using forgiveness and grace. These are huge parts of our witness to the world around us, because when we do this correctly according to Jesus' example, we become very visible, especially in a dark place. How are you going to shine today?


