

What's Involved in a Missions Partnership?

Southern Baptists have one of the most effective international missions programs in the world. The International Mission Board, or the IMB, is currently supporting 3,548 people in 155 countries around the world. The gospel has been shared 1,609,869 times through those missionaries and 144,964 have responded with a profession of faith, according to the IMB's website. This work is financed through the generosity of cooperating churches all over North America and beyond.

Southern Baptist missions efforts are well organized and financially strong, but they aren't very personal. New men and women are sent out to the foreign mission field every year, sometimes with their entire family. These new missionaries are well-trained and well-equipped, but they don't always have the kind of personal support they need to make it over the long haul.


That's where our Disciple-Making Pathway comes in. One of the steps along the way to spiritual multiplication is to "Mobilize for Missions." This includes helping some of our global missionaries through a newly formed 3-year partnership. Like all good partnerships, this includes commitments from both sides of the relationship. For our church, this means special celebrations for the birthdays and anniversaries of our missionaries and their family. It also means sending a team at least once a year to work with the missionaries on the field and supporting special ministry projects as requested. This also assumes that we will continue supporting the work of all our IMB missionaries through the Cooperative Program, the B.J. Higgins Missions fund, and the Lottie Moon Christmas offering.

This partnership means our missionary friends will promise to send us regular prayer requests and praises so we can be involved in their ongoing ministry. It also means we can look forward to a live or pre-recorded video message from them at least once a year. From time to time, missionaries are allowed to travel home for "stateside assignment," and this also means we can anticipate a personal visit at that time.

Someone might wonder why we would enter a special partnership like this. The first reason is it provides a focus for all of our collective missionary interest. It would be next to impossible to pray for all our IMB personnel on a regular basis, but you can certainly pray for one family. The second reason is to raise interest in the people group they are called to reach. The third reason is to involve our church members in hands-on missions experiences so they can learn and grow in their faith.

I'm pleased to report that during our fall Members' Meeting, we agreed on a 3-year missions partnership with IMB Missionaries Kevin and Karen White. The Whites have 2 sons, Benjamin and Andrew. They are currently in language school with plans to begin service in Bogota, Colombia. We are planning to send a team from our church to work with them and their IMB colleagues in the summer of 2026.

November 30 through December 7 is this year's Week of Prayer for International Missions. As we've done many times before, we'll encourage our church family to pray for handful of very special IMB missionaries, give to support our cooperative missions efforts, and even go on a mission trip this next year, if they are able. This upcoming Christmas season is a great time to "Mobilize for Missions."
