A Story of Revival

A new king means change. In the case of Cyrus the Great, the conqueror of the Medes and the Babylonians, the change meant a new policy for displaced people and their sacred places. In 539 B.C., Cyrus enacted a law allowing such people to return to their homelands and reestablish their previous places of worship with two important requirements. The first was that their worship was performed correctly according to their sacred texts. No modifications or shortcuts should be taken. The second requirement was that prayers for "a long life" would be offered to the various gods on behalf of Cyrus and his son, Cambyses. The new king of the Medo-Persian empire wanted to generate as much goodwill as he could so that he could build a dynasty.


This policy was pleasing to one deity in particular, "the Lord, the God of heaven" (Ezra 1:2). This God was the one who had prompted Cyrus to enact the law which would ultimately fulfill the prophecies in Jeremiah in 25:11 and 29:10. Over the next century, God would move in similar ways through two more kings, Darius the Great and Artaxerxes I, to accomplish His will.

The first wave of Jews, who returned with Zerubbabel, concentrated their efforts on reconstructing the temple. Ezra worked with the second wave of returnees to reestablish their sense of community and identity. Nehemiah came 60 years later with a final wave to rebuild the city walls.

The story in this part of the Bible is not that different from the typical Baptist church that is focused on bodies (attendance), buildings, and budgets. But a closer look reveals much more. A renewed emphasis on worshipping God in the temple, praying with a humble heart, and studying God's Word and applying it are all really a story about spiritual revival. Ezra is all about a time when God's people are brought into a closer relationship with Him, despite all kinds of opponents and obstacles.

This is a story we all need to hear. Revival isn't an annual tradition or a date on the calendar - it's a move of God! As we familiarize ourselves with how God has moved in the past, we can get better at recognizing how God moves today and participate in it.

This spring and Easter season, we will be talking about Ezra's story of revival. We will also be talking about the revival that was unleashed when Jesus Christ stepped out of the grave on the third day after His crucifixion. Don't miss an installment as we study this story together starting on Sunday, March 8.





Youth Ministry Essentials

Mother and Son: The Respect Effect by Emerson Eggerichs, PhD


Although this book's target audience is for moms toward their sons, much can be applied for parenting both sons and daughters and can be useful for both moms and dads. From a biblical perspective, Mother and Son The Respect Effect defines respect, shows countless examples of how to parent with respect, and why kids yearn for respect.

Emerson lays a foundation using an acronym he coined as GUIDES which stands for:

- G**ive so a child's basic physical needs can be met
- U**nderstand so a child is not provoked or exasperated
- I**nstruct so your child can know and apply God's wisdom
- D**iscipline so your child can correct poor choices
- E**ncourage so your child can courageously develop God-given gifts
- S**upplicate in prayer so your child can experience God's touch and truth

To me it seemed this book made some generalizations that aren't always true, but it has enough good insights that make it worth reading. Read this book as you would enjoy a potluck, take what works for you and your son and leave the rest for others to enjoy.


