Speaker Biographies

Session 1

Tuesday, January 22: "Familial Trafficking in the US"

Kelly Dore is a survivor of familial trafficking.

She is the Executive Director of the National Human Trafficking Survivor Coalition, Survivor Advocate, TEDx Speaker and Legislative Liaison to Congress. Kelly owns a counseling practice, is a businesswoman, and a former Colorado legislator. She has worked with the Obama and Trump administrations and is the Legislative Liaison for United Against Slavery. She is also an Ambassador for Shared Hope International.

Session 2 Tuesday, January 29: "The Scope of Human Trafficking in our County"

Ted Talk: "Three Ways Businesses can fight Sex Trafficking"

Sunshyne Powell, MA, LPCC has worked with at risk youth since the age of 18 when she became a Big Sister for the Big Brothers, Big Sisters program. This experience inspired her to work with at risk youth for the rest of her career. She worked in a residential treatment facility for 3 years before coming to El Paso County Department of Human Services, where she has served youth and their families for the last 13 years. She combats human trafficking in our community as a member of the Metro Area Sex Trafficking Task Force. She has a master's degree in Community Mental Health Counseling from Adams State University.

Session 3 Monday, February 4: "A Call to Action: What the Military Can and Should Do About Sex Trafficking"

Dan O'Bryant (attorney) is an advocate in the battle against sex trafficking. As a 2015-16 Fellow at the Weatherhead Center for International Affairs at Harvard University, he gave presentations and researched the topic, returning as an Associate for the Fall 2016 term. He served as the Chairman of the Board of Anti-trafficking NGO Shared Hope International from 2013-2016 and remains on the board. SHI is an international leader in the fight to bring an end to sex trafficking, particularly of children. In September of 2017, he joined the Board of Directors of the National Center on Sexual Exploitation. NCOSE has become the leading national organization shining a light on the links between all forms of sexual exploitation and on the public health crisis of pornography.

Molly Griffiths is a representative from Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT). TAT is a non-profit organization formed to "educate, equip, empower and mobilize members of the trucking and travel plaza industry to combat human trafficking."

Sherry Saehlenou has a long career in the aviation industry both as a flight attendant (for PAN AM and United) and as a cabin safety instructor for the Boeing Company. Along with speaking at global flight attendant conferences, to help raise awareness, she also helps train the aviation industry to recognize and report suspected trafficking and abuse victims as a member of Airlines Ambassadors International; American Airlines Ambassadors for flight attendants.
