Yearning for Something Better

"First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for everyone, for kings and all who are in high positions, so that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and dignity." 1 Timothy 2:1

A week or so ago, I was asked by someone, "Why did you not include Charlie Kirk in the Prayers of Intercession at worship?" That was a fair question.

As most of you know, I'm not one to quickly and publicly jump into political discourse— especially from the pulpit. As Christians, we have a duty to pray for our country and its leaders. We often do so in a general way within the prayers. Then comes the issue of what specific things do we remember in the prayers. We could look at each week's news and pray for hours on end! It's tough to make a call on what to include and what not to include—especially if you'd prefer to not come across as partisan.

The shooting of Charlie Kirk reminds us once again. We have seen way too much violence and too many shootings within our culture. Minnesota House Speaker Melissa Horman and her husband were killed in their home earlier this year. Donald Trump survived an assassination attempt in 2024. The husband of Nancy Pelosi was bludgeoned with a hammer in his home in 2022. Steve Scalise was shot during a practice session for a Congressional Baseball Game in 2017. Gabby Giffords was shot in the head in a supermarket parking lot in 2011. No doubt, I'm missing others. Mental illness, violence and hatred can cut across all political lines.

I have no easy answer other than "Jesus". The way of Jesus is so contrary to what we see around us. He is our only hope. He is the light in our dark world. Love is always better than hatred. Peace is always better than violence. Kindness is always better than being mean. Don't cave to societal pressure. Submit to Jesus.

Could we do a better job of remembering specific people in prayer? Probably. Having said that, you can be confident that I would miss things periodically and I'd be leaning on your grace. There's also a time when specific prayers can be lifted up from the pews.

Voting Item—October Congregational Meeting

At the 2025 Mission Convocation in Pittsburgh, delegates voted to approve three amendments to the NALC Constitution.



- 1. The movement of some language in the Constitution to Bylaws, clean up Scrivener's errors.
- 2. Addition of Article on the North American Lutheran Seminary
- 3. Addition to current Article 16 entitled, "Indemnification" to be renamed, "Legal and Financial Matters."

As required by the NALC's constitution, these changes need to be approved by 50% of the congregations in order to be ratified. At our October 12th congregational meeting, we will be voting on the proposed amendments. Members may contact the church office to see the full content of the changes.

Sabbatical Proposal

The Council at its September meeting approved bringing the matter of a sabbatical leave for Pastor John before the congregation at its October 12 meeting.

Context

In 2022, the congregation approved submitting a grant for a sabbatical in 2023 with the understanding that if we got the grant, Pastor John would take a sabbatical. We did not receive the grant. Grant applications were resubmitted with the Council approval in 2023, 2024 and 2025 as well. Grant funds were not approved. This time, Pastor John is pursuing taking a sabbatical and funding it himself.

Content

The proposed sabbatical would be a time of rest, renewal, and prayer. It would last as long as three months in 2026. The time would mostly include travel and time with family.

Covering Pastoral Duties

Pastoral leadership on Sunday mornings would be covered by pastors as well as a few special Sundays such as a Women's Ministry Sunday, Men's Ministry Sunday, and a Youth Sunday. In case of pastoral emergencies, more than one pastor would be available on call.

Finances

Pastor John would cover all expenses, including the expenses of pastoral coverage and duties. The congregation would continue Pastor John's normal compensation, including pension contributions and benefits, throughout the sabbatical. The following is the anticipated budget:

Sabbatical Expenses \$25,550
Pastoral coverage and duties <u>8,500</u>
Total \$34,050

Members of the congregation who wish to support the sabbatical would be able to do so through the end of 2026 by contributing to a dedicated fund managed by the church. Pastor John would submit properly documented expenses, not to exceed the available balance of the fund.

The congregation would record all contributions and regularly update church leadership on the fund's status. If contributions exceeded the actual expenses, any remaining balance would remain in the designated sabbatical fund for future use.

As is customary, a pastor is expected to remain with the congregation for at least one year following a sabbatical. If Pastor John were to depart within that year, he would reimburse the congregation for the full amount of funds received for the sabbatical, which would then be returned to the designated sabbatical fund for future use.


