Beginning Steps - Parent Polling Summary

Beginning Steps recently conducted a questionnaire aimed at getting parents' views on the Beginning Steps Childcare program. Parents were asked to rate the overall quality of childcare, general curriculum and Christian education. Parents were also asked to rate the physical appearance of both the Education Building and children's classrooms. Finally, parents were asked to rate their overall comfort level when dropping children off in the morning and picking children up in the evening and how they thought their children enjoyed the Beginning Steps program. Parents were asked to select ratings based on a scale of 1 to 5 (from "Poor" to "Excellent").

A review of the data shows that parents overwhelmingly believe Beginning Steps to be a great place for their children to gather and learn with over 80% seeing our programs and facilities as Good to Excellent. Over 97% of parents said they'd recommend Beginning Steps to their friends.

Finally, the survey determined that, while parents overwhelmingly reported that they love and support the Beginning Steps ministry at First Baptist, only 44% regularly attend church. The fields are surely ripe for harvest. So, let's encourage these, and other, non-churched families to visit First Baptist Plainfield as the opportunities present.

The numbers break down as follows: 6 in the nursery, 24 preschoolers, & 54 elementary children. (29 of these elementary children have come to BLAST for Kids.) 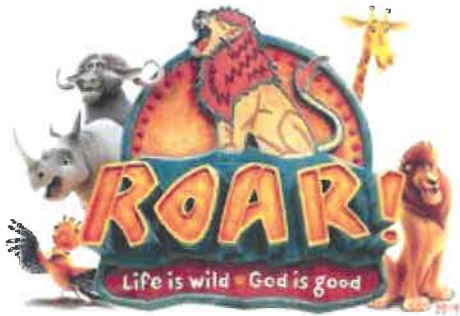

Faith and Reason: A Deeper Look

From an internal basis, few things are more harmful to Christianity than how certain people seem to want to suck all the joy out of it. I'm sure you know the type of person I mean; No music, no joking, no dancing. They seem to think that everything remotely enjoyable or fun is automatically bad. And, considering that our culture tends to give the most attention to the people who shout the loudest, and also how the loudest people are usually the ones on the fringes, it's no surprise to me at all that so many people think of belief as a downer. Consider Lewis' mention, in *mere Christianity*, of a boy who was asked what God was like and answered that God was 'Always watching and waiting to catch you having fun so He can stop you.'

Many years ago I visited a service at another church. And during the message, the pastor went on and on about what a terrible song '*I Can Only Imagine*' is. His argument, basically, focused heavily on the part of the song that says "Surrounded by Your glory, what will my heart feel? Will I dance for you Jesus, or in awe of you be still." He was quite angry over this, asking if anyone would "Dance a little jig" before the Creator of the universe. And as I sat there, the very first thought to enter my mind was, "David did."

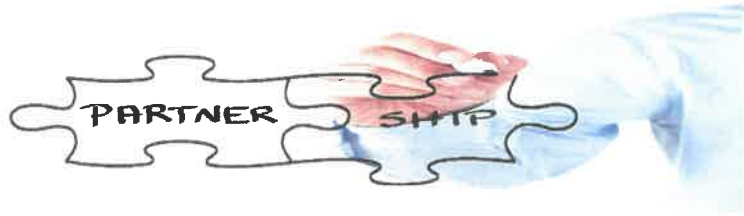
II Samuel 6: 14 - "And David danced before the Lord with all his might." You see, what nearly all of these kinds of arguments have in common is that they are quickly disproved by simply reading the scriptures. We're not supposed to dance? Then why did David? We're not supposed to sing? Then why are Paul and other early Christians recorded as singing hymns so often? We're not supposed to joke? Then why are the scriptures filled with Hebrew and Greek word plays and inside jokes? Don't let anyone take away the joy of being saved, the joy of a life in service to God. For to lose the joy, is to lose the message.

Vision 2020 Update: Partnering With our Boards to Bring Plans to Life

The Vision 2020 Team has been planning for some time now, and that will continue because the world around us continues to change. They have also been partnering with our boards to bring some plans to life.

The Vision 2020 team that is working on the objective “Create a Vibrant and Meaningful Youth and Young Adult Ministry” created a Search Team and partnered with the Personnel Board to find and hire Nikki Edrington as our new Associate Pastor of Youth and Young Adults. That is a foundational victory. It impacts everything we will do from here forward on that objective because we want Nikki to take ownership and help shape the Youth and Young Adults Ministry for the future of FBCP. Thanks to Sue Kirkpatrick, Laura Lemons and their teams for their great teamwork and successful execution of a challenging search and for finding a great new staff member. Preparations for Nikki’s arrival are underway. We are very excited to see what Nikki has in store for our Youth and Young Adults.

The Vision2020 First Impressions Team will be partnering with the Property Board to begin making some improvements to our church signage, and to install a Welcome Center inside our main entrance. Bekah Gaidis leads the First Impressions Team and Ron Saxman leads the Property Board. Plans are to update the existing church signs on Stafford Road and Simmons Road. Plans also include creation and placement of new signage on our “Main Entrance” to direct first-time visitors to the Main Entrance which will lead them to a new centralized Welcome/Information Center. The First Impressions Team is conducting research on the best welcome center for us and will be bringing recommendations to the Vision 2020 Team and then the Executive Board. Finally, Bekah and Ron will be partnering to place a small sign on Stafford Road to direct people to our Simmons Street parking lot and main entrance. The First Impressions Team discovered that vehicle GPS navigation systems direct people to the south side of our church. This would be potentially confusing for people coming to our church from the west as they will not see our parking lot from that direction. All these changes are intended to help first-time visitors get to the right place, and ultimately to the Welcome Center where they will be greeted by people who have been trained to take care of all needs of a first-time visitor. Thanks to Ron, Bekah and their teams for partnering to bring these ideas to life in our church.

Once again, we continue to hear nothing but awesome support from our church family about the steps our Vision 2020 Team and our Boards are taking to make improvements in our church. We can’t even begin to thank you enough. Your support means so much. While other churches bicker about every small change, our church is supporting change and even pushing for more and faster change. You should be aware – and proud – that you are exceptional. Few church leaders have the kind of support our church leaders have. And, your support helps raise the level of excitement in our church.
