We have made some improvements in our 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter giving: the mission giving shortage of \$1,366.99 is the lowest this year, the shortage is mainly due to our lack of giving to ABC United Missions, which supports various ministries throughout ABC USA. We have paid our three Missionaries \$350 each month, Edna Martin \$50 per month and ABC IN/KY \$83 per month. Let's keep up the good work FBC Plainfield and make that shortage even lower in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter!

The last two months of the year are recognized as months set aside for expressing our thanks to show appreciation and giving gifts to those we wish to honor. It is also the time of our last big offering for 2025, the **RETIRED MINISTERS AND MISSIONARIES OFFERING (RMMO)**. Recipients include retired ordained ministers and commissioned missionaries who have devoted 15 years or more to ABC-USA (American Baptist Churches United States of America). A Legacy of Love: Honoring Those Who've Served.

I'm sure many in the congregation remember a past minister, retired now, who holds a special place in your heart because of their spiritual guidance, their fun and laughter during party games, and the family who were so much a part of the church, school and community. Following God's call often comes with sacrifice. Many retired ministers, missionaries, and their widowed spouses have served faithfully, yet often lack the resources to fully prepare for life's later seasons -- health challenges, the loss of a spouse, or isolation.

Thank You Checks from money donated in 2024 have already been delivered to 3,331 retired ministers, missionaries, and widowed spouses. The 2024 amount given was divided between two categories—Thank You Checks (62%) and Emergency Assistance (38%). All the money goes to RMMO recipients, in the form of a Thank You Check, and, when necessary, to meet immediate emergency and special financial needs.

The theme for the 2025 RMMO challenge is taken from 1 Corinthians 16:14. Let all that you do be done in love. As retired ministers have shown their love for us through the years, so we too, can show our love to them by giving as God would direct us to this final offering, the Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering (RMMO).
