I can see it on your faces. I can hear your concern through your words. I can read what you write. There is a great deal of chaos in our world today, and it is impacting you.

I am an artist, and I love to study paintings. I observe the shapes, the scenes, and the colors to discover meaning in the picture and what the artist was trying to convey. It's all there, but it can be hard to see. Suppose an artist painted chaos. In your mind, what would a painting of chaos look like? Would it be dark? Foreboding? No discernible images?

There is a scripture passage that paints a picture of chaos. It says: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty; darkness was over the surface of the deep." Genesis 1:1 This is a description of chaos—formless, empty, dark.

How does one paint formless? What shape is it? In my view, something formless has no discernible shape or structure. It is hazy, shadowy, vague, and nebulous. You can't get a good look at it or define it.

How does one convey emptiness in a painting? How can an artist paint emptiness? How can we see emptiness? Emptiness is void of everything. Again, no substance, no shape, no form—nothing.

And then, imagine the formless and the empty being cloaked in total darkness, leaving the viewer incapable of seeing anything, even the obscure and nebulous. This is chaos. It is what pre-creation was like. No order, no structure, no contents, and deep darkness.

AND in that chaotic space, the Spirit of God hovered, present from the very beginning. Present in the formless and empty chaos. The only thing the chaos was not void of was the presence of the Spirit. It all began this way, and it remains this way. Even in our present-day chaos, the Spirit of God is here.

Then, we read the first recorded spoken words of God: "Let there be light." Out of darkness, God spoke light into existence. There was light. It was good

Let's return to our artist theme for a moment. If you were to paint chaos, what would it look like? I imagine most of us don't paint many pictures, and if we did, they probably wouldn't be paintings of chaos, but we know chaos. We can experience it in us and around us, so let me encourage you with two truths.

First, the Spirit of God, the Holy Spirit, is ever-present with us, even in the chaos. When we feel alone, discouraged, covered in darkness, the Spirit of God hovers over our own chaotic world. The Spirit of God is unfazed by chaos.

Second, when all we can see in our lives and world is chaos, remember God's first recorded words: "Let there be light, and there was light", and there is light. May the light of the world shine upon you. May the Lord guide you down paths of righteousness. May you shine like stars in the universe in a crooked and chaotic world (Ph. 2:15). And may you be the light of the world, shining the light and love of Christ in the chaos.

October is a time of transition. The flower beds are turning brown and require more attention. The pond is low, and the fish are jumping more often to catch low flying objects.

Life is also in transition. While reading some Global Servant Journal news, I was made aware of missionaries who have recently died and completed their tasks on earth. Others have simply retired from 35 or 40 years of service on the mission field as a global servant with International Ministries, but plan to continue working in a similar situation as a volunteer because they see a need and feel God's call to continue helping.

The story of Global Servant Susan Hegarty is very interesting. Sue's father was an American Baptist minister in Pennsylvania. He would have loved to have a missionary doctor in the family, but Susan was drawn to languages and deep biblical text. In university she majored in French and minored in Spanish. In 1982, she graduated seminary, with a Master of Arts in Religion. In the mid 80's she organized a mission trip to Nicaragua for her church. In 1989 she returned as a short-term volunteer through International Ministries. From 1991 to 1995 she served as a special service worker. In 1996 she was officially commissioned as an IM global servant. Sue wrote curriculum and held Christian education workshops for Eastern Cuba Baptist Convention, intentionally creating content for teens and young adults. From 1998 to 2010, Sue served in Cuba, teaching Greek and Christian education at the Eastern Baptist Seminary. In 2012, she was invited to Costa Rica where she worked with immigrant women and their children coming out of domestic violence situations. Early on in Latin America she learned an important lesson: ministry is relational. Even as she retires, Sue plans to continue relational ministry, engaging in Bible studies, and volunteering with the Talita Cumi Girls' Club in Costa Rica.

Dig Deeper: Food Insecurity Documentary

Food insecurity is a critical issue affecting millions of people in the United States and around the world, including right here in Indiana.

The Mission Board will be presenting a 30-minute video on **October 8 for the Dig Deeper topic**. This documentary provides valuable insights into the causes, effects, and lived experiences of individuals and families facing food access challenges. When viewing a documentary about food insecurity, consider the following points:

- Personal Narratives: Listen to the firsthand accounts of those who experience food insecurity. Their stories add a human dimension to the data.
- Systemic Causes: Note discussions about the root causes of food insecurity, such as poverty, unemployment, systemic inequities, and access to healthy food
- Community and Policy Responses: Observe examples of community-based solutions, nonprofit
 organizations' roles, and government policies aimed at addressing the problem.
- Call to Action: Many documentaries end with ways viewers can help, such as volunteering, advocacy, or supporting food programs.

After viewing, we will reflect on the main messages and consider discussing your thoughts about what you learned and what actions might make a difference in your community.

The Mission Board will be working on planning a day where we can unite our hands with an organization that provides food for the community in need in late October or early November.
