ENCOURAGEMENT FROM THE PASTOR

"Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past. Ask your father and he will tell you, your elders, and they will explain to you." (Deuteronomy 32:7).

We have a rich history that encompasses a scope of ups and downs, wins and losses. Just as we studied history in school, the Bible urges us to reflect on our spiritual history. In Deuteronomy, the focus is on Israel, which has a special place in God's plan of redemption. God has overseen the mighty angelic kingdom and the Israelite nation. For example, God delivered His people out of Babylonian captivity. And he led the Israelites out of Egypt and through the wilderness, into the promised land of Canaan.

Why is this important to remember? When we remember moments in biblical history and in our own lives where God showed up as a Deliverer, we can shake off fear, knowing that God's Word has the power to deliver us from any perils we may face in the future. When we remember God's grace and mercy from moments in our past, we walk forward with greater humility, knowing that God's hand has been and always will be our guide. God keeps moving us toward the successful conclusion of His purpose because of His love for us.

Let our prayer be, "Merciful God, as we stand in the present in need of Your divine presence, give us a spirit of remembrance. Let us look back on moments when Your grace covered, protected, and sustained. Let the glory of the past bring us peace in the present and prepare us for our future."

Put your faith in action each day this week by meditating on how God's hand has anchored you in the past, comforted you in the present, and is guiding your future.
