Sermon Questions for your Small Group/LifeGroup to think on...

Sermon Outline: Galatians 6:1-10

Sermon Points:

- 1. God's people are to be noticeably marked with grace, humility, and responsibility. (v.1-5)**
- 2. Make the spiritual investment! Don't invest in the flesh! (v.6-9)**
- 3. Carry a servant's heart toward all people in love. (v.10)**

1. Should we be aware of how we are living on an individual level or how we live as a church, or both? Why?
2. What do you think Paul meant by using the term "spiritual"? Why would we want to be restored by someone who is "spiritual"? Are you able to restore gently?
3. Why is pride so dangerous in the life of the believer? Why is pride so dangerous to the life of the church? How does Paul's warning that we too may fall into sin sober you as you seek to come alongside others? Do you ever find yourself guilty of thinking you can "do" life better than others? Why should we grieve when others fail/fall as opposed to cheer?
4. Why are LifeGroups so important to the life of our church? Does God's design for us to go through life together as his people inspire you to connect well with a LifeGroup? What role has your lifegroup played in your spiritual growth here at EBC?
5. What are you investing in? Are you investing in the Spirit or are you invested in the flesh? How consistent is your current actions, thoughts, speech with the answer you just gave? In what ways are you investing in others and in the life of our church?
6. What does it look like to sow to the flesh? What does it look like to sow to the Spirit? Why is it important to remember that God will hold us accountable on how we invested?
7. Why do you think Paul reminds us and his readers that we will reap our sowing in the Spirit if we don't give up? What is your current perspective on the Christian life? Is it a life of maximum performance or endurance? Why is it important to invest (sow) in a way that prepares us to endure?
8. How do you we do good to those outside the faith? As we live amongst those who are lost and not part of our spiritual family, how do we conduct ourselves? Would people want to meet your King Jesus if they spent time with you?
9. John 13:34-35, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

Can people say that you carry a servant's heart toward them? Do you represent the Kingdom well? Do you love and serve those in this body? Is there a relationship that needs to be restored? Is there someone you need to graciously deal with? Is there someone who you can serve and encourage?
