

I want to thank you for your recent gift to Sipe's Orchard Home. We received your "noisy offering" donation of \$273.00 on 12/8/2023.

Sipe's Orchard Home is celebrating its 80th anniversary this year. This is an accomplishment that few nonprofits achieve. One of the things I am most proud of is that we are serving more children and youth in more ways than we ever have before. We offer a driving education program, to help our youth get their licenses, which is virtually essential to a successful adult life. We have our Young Adults in Transition program, which helps our youth when they are ready to move into their own apartment and stays in touch with them after they move to help them with the inevitable bumps in the road they encounter.

Most of our teens come to us through child welfare. They come from foster care or group homes. In their late teens, they are aging out of the system, but unprepared to live independently. Others fall through the cracks in the bureaucracy. We are working with two teens who are couch-surfing or homeless. Both have experienced significant abuse, so are understandably slow to trust others. Suzy ran from an abusive home as a teen and has been on her own for about two years. She wants to complete school and has started a job even though transportation is difficult. Ivanna is homeless, with a significant mental health history. She is afraid of crowds, so she doesn't want to go to a shelter. She is smart, quiet, and wants to finish school. We will be working with both to stabilize their housing, find employment and begin working towards other goals. It is the support of donors like you that makes it possible for us to help Suzy, Ivanna, and all the other teens we serve.

ANNOUNCING THE REIGN OF GOD SUMMARY BY REV. DR TED RUST

- 1. Telling the Gospel confidently means "the kingdom of God has come near to you." (Luke 10:11) Share this good news.
- 2. Telling the Gospel confidently means putting into practice the **actual speaking to others** that God loves them completely through Jesus Christ.
- 3. Telling the Gospel confidently can be learned and practiced through church witness teams and other spiritual groups.
- 4. Telling the Gospel confidently means to point out God's presence and activity in our lives and announce the reign of God the way the Lord's followers did in the Holy Scriptures.
- 5. Telling the Gospel confidently involves a **more intentional awareness** of God's presence and work in every day and in every experience and a willingness to share this with others.
- 6. Telling the Gospel confidently means we are "not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone." (Romans 1:16) Our confidence is not in ourselves and in our abilities, but in God's power and love which can change lives.
- 7. Telling the Gospel confidently is to answer this question—"where did you notice God at work in recent days?" This must be shared and communicated with others in a loving way, but with a sense of urgency.
- 8. Telling the Gospel confidently is to imagine what God is doing at a particular time and place and to share this in an authentic and merciful way with others. "For God so loved the world." (John 3:16)
- 9. Telling the Gospel confidently begins with a passion and desire to improve one's awareness of God's work in daily life and improve one's ability to communicate this good news. **Just do it and don't worry about how worthy you are to do it.** Trust in God's ability to use you as an instrument of his love and kingdom.
- 10. Telling the Gospel confidently means to see life in a new way...always surrounded by God's grace and mercy and to begin to communicate effectively that God's reign is breaking into our lives.
- 11. Telling the Gospel confidently is to share forgiveness, love, and hope with someone who is hurting.
- 12. Telling the Gospel confidently is to always focus on life and new possibilities rather that on death and despair. Jesus came "that we may have life, and have it abundantly." You will be a positive witness to Christ's life, death, and resurrection at all times and places...even if you stand alone.



- 13. Telling the Gospel confidently will often include listening, sharing, helping, welcoming, accepting, forgiving, being bold, and being inspired by people in scriptures who stepped out of their comfort zones.
- 14. Telling the Gospel confidently involves getting information from a person tactfully. One uses casual conversation rather than direct questioning. "Since moving to the area have you found it possible to attend church regularly?" Look for common bonds and interests.
- 15. Telling the Gospel confidently means to approach every person and home in a **prayerful stance** and never "apologize" for your visit. You are doing the Lord's work. Be friendly and speak with enthusiasm about God's Church, God's work and Kingdom.
- 16. Telling the Gospel confidently is more than just "talking about Evangelism." It is actually doing Evangelism. It is listening to another person with a loving heart and clearly announcing the reign of God and His love in their life. We seek to connect the person with God's Church and God's work.
- 17. Telling the Gospel confidently will include obeying Christ's Great Commission of Matthew 28:19-20: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." If God is with us, how can we be afraid and lack confidence?
- 18. Telling the Gospel confidently involved re-discovering our primary purpose which is to reach those who are not a part of Christ's Kingdom or Church. We are called to reach those who do not know Jesus as their Lord and Savior. We must not forget our true Biblical purpose for existence as a Church. We do not have 10 or 20 purposes in the Church—only one—to share God's love with others and help them become disciples in Christ's Church. We announce God's reign and love today! (not someday).
- 19. Telling the Gospel confidently will require we follow God's Holy Spirit and Word. The Gospel is **not** about us (and our abilities or lack of abilities), it is about God's love, God's kingdom, and God's promise of everlasting life. **God's Spirit will guide us to recapture our purpose and, once again be the Church...telling the Gospel confidently...and announcing the reign of God.**
