

Since shelters were opened for this disaster, the Red Cross and our partners have provided 71 overnight stays for more than 35 residents in 2 emergency shelters. There were 0 new shelter registrations overnight.



With the help of partners, a total of 4609 meals and snacks have been provided. Of the total meals served, 0 are shelf stable meals delivered where other resources are unavailable. To date, 193 relief items including comfort kits and other supplies have been provided to people in need and 84 total households



The operations are supported by 105 trained Red Cross disaster workers. Of these, there are 14 who are trained to support health and mental health services, and Spiritual care needs in the shelters and throughout the community. Workers have provided support to 1 EOC locations in the state.



Red Cross caseworkers have opened 60 cases, serving 128 people with recovery support, including financial assistance, replacement of eyeglasses and



Red Cross reunification support has received 0 welfare information requests and have successfully completed 0 of those requests



Preliminary damage reports indicate that of the 222 total assessments done to date, 56 homes were either destroyed or suffered major damage
