Would You Like to Be a Communion Envoy?

Recently, some of our Communion Envoys have retired from their faithful service, and we have a need for 4-6 new envoys. You are invited to consider becoming an envoy here at St. Mark's. Below are facts and questions (FAQ) related to this important ministry. If you are interested in becoming a Communion Envoy please speak to Communion Envoy Leader, Tim Carpenter, or to Pastor Gary.

What is a Communion Envoy? Communion Envoys are messengers of God's love and care, and are representatives of the body of Christ by extending the Sunday Holy Communion meal to shut-ins.

Why is this ministry important? Communion envoys literally share the presence of Christ. Christ is present, in, with, and under the bread and wine – the body and blood of Christ. Shut-ins thereby receive the same intimate presence and support for their lives as those on Sunday at the Table of our Lord.

When and how often do Communion Envoys share the meal? Envoys usually make brief visits to share the meal the first Sunday of each month, or soon thereafter. Once a month meets the need.

How do Communion Envoys extend the elements of the community meal? Communion kits are prepared by the Altar Guild each month that the envoys use, who then return them by placing them on the Altar for replenishment.

How and where do Communion Envoys get the Communion Kits? Kits are prepared and placed on the altar the first Sunday of each month. Thereafter, they are inside the cabinet under the table of the Altar for Envoys to pick up.

What do Communion Envoys say when they serve communion? A script is provided to Envoys for guidance and serving communion.

How are Communion Envoys organized? Envoys pair up to make a team to visit shut-ins. Tim Carpenter works with Pastor Gary to oversee and to communicate with the envoys regarding needs, assignments, and address changes.



Can a husband and wife team serve together? Yes, spouses may serve together.

So, is it OK for a layperson to do communion? Yes, indeed, laypersons are permitted to do so, much like our Assisting Ministers, as an extension of Holy Communion already presided over by the pastor.

Does this take the place of pastors taking communion to our shut-ins? No, pastors continue to offer and preside over communion with our shut-ins on an as needed basis and/or on request.

May I do this for a trial period, or for a specified time – say, for one year? Yes, you may.

How would I begin as an Envoy? Please call Tim Carpenter or Pastor Gary. You will be paired with an experienced Envoy to join them in visits and to learn how to serve as an Envoy.

What can I expect if I decide to explore this ministry or to become an Envoy? You can expect to be enriched by meeting, visiting, and sharing the meal with our shut-ins. Your service will be deeply appreciated by them and the community of faith. You will know without question by your service that you are a "good and faithful servant" of Christ.

Day Camp at Trinity Village in Hickory for Ages 5—12

Lutheroad Day camp will be led by counselors from Camp Lutheridge, together with staff members and volunteers from Trinity Village. Camp will be intergenerational and campers will participate in music, arts and crafts, games, Bible study, and nature programs. Lutheroad Day Camp is for youth ages 5-12 and seniors at Trinity Village. The camp takes place at Trinity Village, 1265 21st St, NE, Hickory.

St. Mark's is offering \$85 scholarships for members' children to be able to attend Lutheroad Day Camp, Monday, June 18—Thursday, June 21, 9am—4pm. Friday, June 22, will be 9am until noon. Cost of the camp is \$110.

Register by June 1 with a \$25 deposit. Remaining balance of \$85 is due by June 7. Once you have paid the \$25 deposit, you can request the \$85 scholarship. (This scholarship does not affect those who wish to apply for a scholarship for other

Opportunities for School Age Children to Sign up For Summer Camp Camp Scholarships Are Available

Camp is made for kids! Activities include swimming, crafts, active games, stories, songs, campfires, engaging Bible lessons, creative worship, and more. Fantastic college-aged counselors are excellent role models who keep kids safe and help them make friends. Contact www.novusway.com for details on camping opportunities and their registration process. Once registered, then contact the church office for the St. Mark's Camping Scholarship. After your child has attended camp, then they will be eligible for the Alec Calvin Sigmon Memorial Scholarship.

St. Mark's Camping Scholarship

St. Mark's currently provides a scholarship of \$150 per camper per summer for members of the church. The cost of camp per week for per child is approximately \$450. The following guidelines have been developed:

- The funds are available for those in grades 1 − 12.
- Scholarships are given to those who attend one of the Lutheran camps for a full week. An exception to this is camp for 1st and 2nd graders which is less than one week.
- ◆ The total amount per camper to be given once per year is \$150.
- For a full week of camp, the church will pay \$150. For those that attend a half week session, the church will
 pay up to \$150 but the total, when combined with the Alec Calvin Sigmon Memorial Camp Scholarship will
 not exceed the cost of the camp.
- The funds will be awarded after the camper is registered.
- Families will need to contact www.novusway.com for information on camping opportunities and their registration process.
- Please contact the church office for more details.

If there are extraordinary circumstances related to finances in sending your child or children to camp, please speak with Pastor Haddock. St. Mark's will work to see that finances are not a hindrance to attending camp.

Alec Calvin Sigmon Memorial Camp Scholarship



In October 2014, we tragically lost Alec Sigmon in a car accident. We still miss him, and invite you to continue to pray for the family. Alec loved camp – particularly Lutherock. The family has designated that memorial funds given, and those that continue to be given in his memory, be specifically given as camping scholarships to those who attend Lutheran camps. 


