

My Beloved Disciples of St. Mark's,

9/10/2023

As our time together is drawing to a close, I wanted to take just a few minutes to share some of my personal reflections with you about our life together these past three plus years.

First thank you for affirming my call to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament based on your vote in January of 2020. I was transitioning from the Ministry of Word and Service having served for 10 years as a Deacon. Through your call process and vote you affirmed this new ministry call, and I joined you on February 23, 2020 to begin our journey together. We celebrated my ordination on March 1, 2020, with great joy and celebration.

Unfortunately, our time to get to know one another through personal interactions was complicated by the Covid pandemic. But through Zoom calls, outdoor worship services, and phone calls we were able to make connections and begin to build relationships with one another.

It was a surprise to all of us when Pastor Gary retired. I had hoped to be able to serve with him longer but that was not to be. At the beginning of my call I was told that when Pastor Gary did retire, a full time intentional interim would come and join us as we moved into a time to discern and imagine together the future of St. Mark's and who God was calling the congregation to be and do. This person would also help me and the congregation until it was determined who would serve as the next Senior Pastor.

During this time, I took on additional responsibilities and was excited to have Pastor Roger Storm and Pastor Paul Birkedal both join us here for short periods of time. Unfortunately, however, we were not able to find nor was there available an intentional interim for St. Mark's. So it was decided last Fall to move past this hope for a full-time intentional interim, and a call committee was formed and trained beginning the formal process of calling a Senior Pastor.

I met with the call committee and shared with them my thoughts and experiences here at St. Mark's. We mutually agreed to continue to have conversation, and then after much prayer and discernment when it was offered, I agreed to be the primary candidate for Senior Pastor. Thank you to the members of the Call Committee: Melanie, Marcheta, David, Shawn, Jennifer, Maria, Tray, Elaine, and Tamarah. Thank you for the work that you did during the call process.

Part of the agreement made with the call committee and council was to continue to look for additional pastoral help and to do the work of visioning and discernment with a Pastoral Consultant and the congregation. A discernment http://www.youtube.com/@st.marks | team was quickly formed, and I want to publicly say thank you to them: Kendra, Melanie, Nicky, Dale, Matthew, Terry, and Tamarah.

Thank you also to everyone who has served on the Congregation council including our presidents, David and Terry, and all those who served on ministry teams over the past 3 years. You partnered with me and disciples of this congregation in the work of ministry, and I truly appreciate the work you did and continue to do.

Thank you to all those who have volunteered and worked in the church office and in worship leadership with me since my arrival: Mary, Paula, Debbie, Deanna, Wendy, Nicky, Emily, Steven, our technology team, our Praise team and choir, our newsletter volunteers, our tabulators, and many others who came to answer the phone and do odd jobs that needed attention. Thank you to our custodians for caring for our building: Larry, Keegan, and Nikki.

During my time with you, the people of St. Mark's, since February of 2020 to now, I have had the honor and privilege of walking along side of you all in many different aspects of your lives. You have invited me to share your joys and your sorrows from baptisms, confirmations, weddings, graduations, funerals, and other events. We have laughed together, cried together, hugged one another, mourned, danced, celebrated, and shared ourselves with each other. Please know that I consider all these moments to be holy and sacred.

We have tried new things, some of which have been successful and some of which we can say at least we tried. We have had new brothers and sisters join our faith community, and we have also said goodbye to others through their moving away, death, or transfer to another community.

Through it all, I know you all have tried to remain faithful to the call of God as have I. Making the decision to step away from my call here at St. Mark's has been a very difficult decision for me. But I do feel it is what I need to do for myself and also for the future of St. Mark's.

Saying good-bye is never easy. But sometimes we are called to do hard things, and for me this is one of those things. I love you all just as much, if not more, than I did when I stood before you in January and thanked you for your vote of confidence in calling me to serve as your Senior Pastor. You entrusted me with this call as Senior Pastor and have supported me in many and various ways.

I know I have not always done things as some would have liked and have probably left things undone that I should not have. Yet as we pray in our confession, "please forgive me for the things I have done and the things I have failed to do, known and unknown." I understand that there may be people who are not happy with things I have said or done. I have stated in meetings, worship, and to our congregation council that I could only hope that if there was a grievance or something that I needed to know, the people would reach out to me personally so that we could talk about these things and come to a place of reconciliation. All I can say at this point is I tried my best to be honest and follow the words of Micah 6:8, "What does the Lord require of you but to do justice and to love kindness and to walk humbly with your God?" As Lutherans we understand that we are all created in God's image and live in a broken sinful world. We go before God and ask for forgiveness and know God forgives each of us through our confession. I hope you can also forgive me. I hope that if you feel I have not affirmed you or thanked you for what you have done and given to this congregation and to me, that you hear me say now, "Thank you for answering the call and thank you for all you have done."

There is a prayer that says, "God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen"

I did not know that my time as your Senior Pastor would be for the time it has been. But I do go with the faith and trust that it is what is right. I am sad and so sorry that some people do not like that I have made this decision. I also have learned there are some members who did not like what I wrote in my letter announcing my leave from call. My words were not meant to be hurtful or malice but instead I was sharing how I felt and the thoughts, 3 experiences, and feelings I have and have had. I was being honest and truthful from my perspective. Please know and hear me when I say, I am sorry if my words caused you hurt.




