Inclusive Pro Tips

For a version with less movement, tape the butcher paper to the table and draw a large circle. Model and encourage children to use the dot markers to add green to the world.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Cut a large circle out of the blue paper and tape it to the wall at the child's height.
- 2. Place the green circle stickers nearby for easy access.

During the Activity

- One at a time, invite a child to take a green sticker, spin around once then place their sticker onto the blue circle.
- 2. Encourage them to keep placing stickers until the blue circle has plenty of green spots, representing land on Earth.

After the Activity

1. Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come over here! We're going to play a fun game to help us learn about something special."

During the Activity

"Do you see this big blue circle? (PAUSE.) It's very blue and very big! Let's add some green to our big blue circle. Let's take turns spinning and adding green stickers! [Child's name], take a green sticker and do one good spin. (PAUSE.) Great spinning! Now go ahead and stick your green circle on the big blue circle. (PAUSE.) Great job! Let's keep going! [Child's name], your turn to take a green circle and spin! (CONTINUE WITH EACH CHILD.) Look at all the green we're adding! Let's keep going! (REPEAT UNTIL YOU GET THE DESIRED EFFECT.) Wow! You all did such an amazing job."

After the Activity

"This (POINT THE BIG BLUE CIRCLE) looks a lot like the world we're going to talk about today in our Bible Story. Let's get ready to hear a Bible Story to find out how God made the whole world to the moon and back!"

Transition \rightarrow Move to Worship and Story by looking for green and blue items along the way.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come stand with me, and let me tell you our brand-new Memory Verse! Ready to hear it? It goes like this. 'God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) saw everything he had made. (BINOCULAR EYES) And it was very good,' (TWO THUMBS UP) Genesis 1:31. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK)"

During the Activity

"Now, let's learn the motions. The first part of our verse says: 'God.' (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN.) Put one hand up straight in front of you with your thumb almost touching your forehead like this. (STRAIGHT, FLAT HAND WITH THUMB AT YOUR FOREHEAD.) Then you move hand straight down in front of you like this, (PULL DOWN) and say, 'God.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'Saw everything he had made.'
(BINOCULAR EYES) Make circles with both hands and put them up to your eyes like this (PUT BOTH YOUR HANDS TO YOUR EYES LIKE BINOCULARS OR GLASSES.) and say, 'saw everything he had made.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Wonderful! Now let's put that together. 'God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) saw everything he had made. (BINOCULAR EYES) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'And it was very good.' (TWO THUMBS UP.) Put both thumbs up out in front of you like this (ARMS OUT, THUMBS UP.) and say, 'and it was very good.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Nice job! Now let's put that together. 'God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) saw everything he had made. (BINOCULAR EYES) And it was very good.' (TWO THUMBS UP.)

"Now the last part is: 'Genesis 1:31.' (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Put your hands together in front of you and open them like you are opening a book (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) and say: Genesis 1:31 (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job! I think we are ready to do it all together! Ready friends? 'God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) saw everything he had made. (BINOCULAR EYES) And it was very good,' (TWO THUMBS UP) Genesis 1:31. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) Nice job. Let's do it again!" (REPEAT SEVERAL TIMES.)

After the Activity

"The Bible teaches us that God made everything, to the moon and back! God made you and [BASIC TRUTH] God made me, [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything! Who made everything? [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by looking for all the different lights as you walk.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Fluff cotton balls and glue them to a piece of blue cardstock to look like clouds in a sky.

During the Activity

- 1. Gather the children around you.
- Lead the children to do movements that go with Light (flashlight), Dark (black cardstock), Sky (blue cardstock with clouds), and Water (bottle of water).
- 3. When you turn the flashlight on and off, the children will hop, dance, wiggle, and run in place.
- 4. When you hold up the black cardstock, the children will pretend to go to sleep.
- 5. When you hold up the sky with clouds, the children will pretend to float like a cloud in the sky.
- 6. When you hold up the bottle of water, the children will pretend to sway like the waves in the sea.

After the Activity

1. Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

What You Say

Before the Activity

"Come here everyone! Let's play a game!"

During the Activity

"When I hold up this flashlight, we will pretend we're outside in the light. We can run in place or hop or wiggle around, because that's what we do in the light! Get ready! (TURN THE FLASHLIGHT ON.) The light is on! Run in place, hop, wiggle, or dance in the light! (PAUSE.) Yay! God made light! Say that with me! (WITH CHILDREN.) God made light!

(TURN THE FLASHLIGHT OFF.) "Look! The light is off. It's time to stop. Now, when I hold up this black paper, we will pretend it's dark and time to go to sleep. (BEGIN TO WHISPER.) We can lie down and close our eyes, because that's what we do in the dark. We can even pretend to snore, like this. (MAKE A SNORING SOUND.) Get ready! (HOLD UP THE BLACK CARDSTOCK.) It's dark, time to go to sleep. (PAUSE.) Time to wake up! Everyone up! It's not dark anymore! (PUT DARK PAPER AWAY.)

"This time, when I hold up this blue sky with white, fluffy clouds, we are going to pretend we are the clouds floating around in the big, blue sky. Get ready! (HOLD UP THE SKY.) I see the sky, so it's time to float! Float sweet little clouds! Yay! God made the sky! Say that with me! (WITH CHILDREN.) God made the sky!

(PUT THE SKY PAPER AWAY.) "Look! The sky is gone. It's time to stop. This time, when I hold up this bottle of water, we will pretend we are swaying back and forth like the waves in the water! Get ready! (HOLD UP THE WATER BOTTLE.) Let's start swaying! Hold your arms out and sway back and forth! Sway and sway! Yay, hooray! God put the water down below! (REPEAT AS DESIRED.)

After the Activity

"Okay everyone, gather around me. It's time to stop and listen. On day one, God made light! God called the light day, and He called the dark night. Then, on day two, God made the big, blue sky! God put the sky high up above, and the water down below. God is amazing because [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything! Who made everything? [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything!"

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

- 3. Cut construction paper and tissue paper into 4" x 5" rectangles, one of each per child.
- 4. Write each child's name on their label.

During the Activity

- Encourage children to glue the black rectangle in the bottom left corner and the yellow tissue paper in the top left corner as you review what God made on day one.
- Ask children to glue the blue tissue to the top right corner and the dark blue paper to the bottom right corner as you review what God made on day two.
- 3. Clean hands as needed.
- 4. Ask children to place their label in the middle of their paper.

Assist as needed. Using the dot markers, add one dot of each color to the four sections. Give children dot markers to fill in each section, using the colored dot as a guide.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hello everyone! I'm so glad to see you today. Sit at the table with me and let's make a Creation story picture."

During the Activity

"Your paper has four sections. Take this black rectangle and glue it in this bottom section. (POINT.) In the very beginning there was nothing. No people, no animals, no land, no ocean, no sun, just nothing... but there was God. And God was about to do something AMAZING! On the first day, God said, "Let there be...Light!" And there was light. Glue this yellow tissue paper to this rectangle, (POINT.) above the black paper. And God saw that it was good. Then God decided to separate the light from the darkness. Point to the yellow paper. God called the light "day." Point to the black paper. And the dark, "night!" Okay! Now glue this light blue tissue paper to this rectangle on the top (POINT.) and this dark blue paper under it in this rectangle. (POINT.) On day two, God said, "Let there be a sky above and water below." Point to the light blue paper. God put the sky way up high. Now point to the dark blue paper. God put some water way down low. And Then God looked at what He had made and saw that it was good. Now I have one more thing for you to add to your Creation story picture. This label tells you where you can look in the Bible to find today's story. Stick it in the middle of your paper. (PAUSE.) Super job!"

After the Activity

"God is so creative! God had so many more plans of what to make next... because God made everything! Now when you look around at our great big world and see the light and dark, and the sky above the water, you can say, 'Wow! [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything! Who made everything? [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything!"

Show children each symbol as you talk them through the steps to grow like a flower.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Gather children in a circle around you in an open area.

During the Activity

1. Pretend to move your body as the different plant life stages.

After the Activity

1. Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends come over here and let's stand in a circle together."

During the Activity

"We are going to pretend to be a flower today! Most flowers start as little, tiny seeds. Can you make your body teeny tiny, and all balled up on the floor like this? (DEMONSTRATE.) Yes, just like that, you are a tiny seed down in the dirt. Wiggle to get low into the dirt. (PAUSE.) Good job tiny seeds. All these tiny seeds need to grow into flowers. They need water to grow. I'll come around and water you. (WALK TO EACH CHILD AND PRETEND TO POUR WATER FROM A WATERING CAN OVER THEM.) When you get water, you can grow from tiny seeds to big, tall green stems. Slowly stand up tall like a flower stem. (PAUSE.) Now stretch out your arms to make big green leaves. (PAUSE.) Lift your head up high and smile! (PAUSE.) Look at all these beautiful, colorful blooming flowers!" (REPEAT AS DESIRED.)

After the Activity

"In today's true story from the Bible, we're going to hear about who made all the flowers, plants, and trees! Ready? Let's go!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by continuing the activity and pretend to be flowers by standing up straight, reaching arms out to the side, and putting your arms over your head in a circle.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Spread the sheet on the floor in an open area.
- 2. Gather children around the sheet.

During the Activity

1. Encourage children to hold the sheet with both hands and slowly move their arms up and down to make waves across the sheet.

After the Activity

1. Review the Bottom Line and Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come over here with me and let's stand around this big, blue sheet."

During the Activity

"Reach down and grab the edge of the sheet with both hands like this.

(DEMONSTRATE.) Now, slowly move your arms up and down. (PAUSE.)

Awesome! What does the sheet look like to you? (PAUSE FOR ANSWERS.)

Yes! It looks like waves on the water. Let's freeze the waves. (PAUSE.)

Good job! The water is nice and calm but let's make more waves. (REPEAT AS DESIRED.) Freeze the waves and lay the sheet on the ground. (PAUSE.)

That was so much fun making waves with you today."

After the Activity

"In our Bible Story we learned that on day three, God made the land, plants, and seas. When you look around at the great big world and see the plants and trees, and waves in the sea, you can say, WOW! [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything! Who made everything? [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything!"

Inclusive Pro-Tips



For a sensory-friendly version, provide a green paper handprint diecut to decorate.

Using the dot marker or circle stickers, add several "dots" to each finger on their paper.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Copy "Handprint Cactus" on light brown cardstock, one cutout per child.
- 2. Trace each child's hand on green cardstock with a pencil and cut out.
- 3. Write each child's name on their handprint with the permanent marker.
- 4. Cut tissue paper into 3"x3" squares, three per child.
- 5. Pour a small amount of paint on the paper plates, one for every three children.

During the Activity

- Encourage children to glue the cutout pot to the bottom of their handprint.
- 2. Ask children to wad their pieces of tissue and glue them onto their handprint.
- 3. Encourage children to dip the bottom edge of their popsicle stick in the paint and then stamp it on their handprint.
- 4. Clean hands as needed.

After the Activity

1. Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Now take the three pieces of pink tissue and wad each one up. (PAUSE.) Glue them to your handprint. (PAUSE.) Did you know that some cactus plants make pretty pink flowers? They do! Cactus plants also are very, very prickly and pokey! Take the popsicle stick and press it straight down like this (DEMONSTRATE) then stamp it on your handprint. (PAUSE.) Fantastic! Let's clean our hands and we'll let these dry."

After the Activity

"On day three, God made the great big land. God gathered the waters together and called them "seas." Then God made things start growing on all that land! Trees big and small; trees with big leaves avnd small; even trees with fruit to eat! God also made the grass, plants, and flowers! God is so creative! Let's review days one, two, and three! On day one, God made light and separated it from the darkness. On day two, God made sky over the water. On day three, God made land, plants, and sea. But God wasn't done yet...because God made EVERYTHING. Now when you look around at the great big world and see trees and grass and flowers, you can say, 'Wow! [BOTTOM LINE] God made everything!' "Let's work together to put these Potato Heads together. (HOLD UP SEVERAL MOUTHS.) Here are some mouths, pick one to add. (PAUSE.) We use our mouths to speak. (HOLD UP SEVERAL PAIRS OF EYES.) Here are some eyes, pick a pair to add. (PAUSE.) We use our eyes to see. (HOLD UP SEVERAL EARS.) Here are some ears, pick two ears to add. (PAUSE.) We use our ears to hear. (HOLD UP SEVERAL ARMS AND FEET.) Here are some arms and feet, pick some to add. (PAUSE.) Now add any other pieces that you want. (PAUSE.) Look how fantastic your Potato Heads look! Let's take them apart and this time you can build them any way you want. (REPEAT AS DESIRED.)"

After the Activity

"Today in our Bible Story we'll hear about when God created people like you and me! Let's go hear today's story."

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by saying, "God made [child's name]! Come line up. God made [child's name] too. Come line up. (CONTINUE WITH EACH CHILD.)"
