Going on an Animal Hunt



What You Need

□ Plush or Plastic Animals



Inclusive Pro Tips

For a version with less movement, hide plush animals in the room where they are partially visible, encouraging children to focus on spotting them rather than moving around too much.

Provide children with cardboard or toy binoculars, inviting them to look around the room for the hidden plush animals.

When a child spots an animal, ask them to point to it, then retrieve the animal, name it, and encourage the children to echo you.

Make the animal sound and invite the children to imitate the sound, supporting their participation in a fun and engaging way.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Hide the plush/plastic animals around the room in easy-to-spot places.

During the Activity

 Invite children to go on an animal hunt with you. Encourage children to use their hands as binoculars to search for animals. As they find each one, help them name the animal and make its sound together. Continue until all animals have been found.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hello friends! Today, we're going on an animal hunt! Let's use our binoculars (HOLD BOTH HANDS IN CIRCLES UP TO YOUR EYES) to help us see all the animals! I see some animals hiding—let's find them and name them together!"

During the Activity

"Look over there! (POINT.) What did you find? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSE.) You're right! It's a/an [ANIMAL]! Can you say [ANIMAL]? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSE.) What sound does a/an [ANIMAL] make? (PAUSE FOR ROARING.) Great job! Let's find another one!" (CONTINUE WITH THE DIFFERENT ANIMALS. REPEAT AS DESIRED.)

After the Activity

"Wow! You found and named so many animals! In our Bible Story today, we'll hear about a man named Adam and the good things God gave him to do—like naming all the animals! Let's go find out more!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by pretending to walk like September aniWark(\$tomp like an elephant, hop like a bunny, crawl like a bear).

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come stand with me, and let me tell you our brand-new Memory Verse! Ready to hear it? It goes like this. "'For I know (TOUCH HEAD WITH FINGERTIPS) the plans I have for you,' (MARCH) says the Lord," (POINT UP) Jeremiah 29:11. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK)"

During the Activity

"Now, let's learn the motions. The first part of our verse says: 'For I know.'

(TOUCH HEAD WITH FINGERTIPS.) Put your hand up and tap the side of your head like this (TAP YOUR TEMPLE.) and say, 'For I know.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'The plans I have for you.' (MARCH.)
March in place like this (MARCH) and say, 'The plans I have for you.'
(REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Wonderful! Now let's put that together. 'For I know (TOUCH HEAD WITH FINGERTIPS) the plans I have for you.' (MARCH.)
Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'Says the Lord.' (POINT UP.) Put one finger up and point to the sky like this (POINT UP) and say, 'says the Lord.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Nice job! Now let's put that together. "'For I know (TOUCH HEAD WITH FINGERTIPS) the plans I have for you,' (MARCH) says the Lord.' (POINT UP.)

"Now the last part is: 'Jeremiah 29:11.' (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Put your hands together in front of you and open them like you are opening a book (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) and say: Jeremiah 29:11. (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job! I think we are ready to do it all together! Ready friends? 'For I know (TOUCH HEAD WITH FINGERTIPS) the plans I have for you,' (MARCH) says the Lord," (POINT UP) Jeremiah 29:11. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) Nice job. Let's do it again!" (REPEAT SEVERAL TIMES.)

After the Activity

"The Bible teaches us that God has plans for [CHILD'S NAME], and [CHILD'S NAME]... (SAY EACH CHILD'S NAME.) God has plans for you and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me! Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me!"

For a version with less movement, offer alternatives like clapping, waving, or gently moving their arms to represent the animal instead of physically moving across the room.

If using this version, adjust wording in What You Say section accordingly.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Invite children to stand against the wall in your activity area.
- 2. Place an animal sticker on each child's hand.
- 3. Talk about each child's animal.
- 4. Move to the middle of your area, across from the children.

During the Activity

- Encourage children to move to you like the animal on their sticker when you name it.
 - → For example, if you say "elephant," the child with the elephant sticker will stomp to you. If you say "bunny rabbit," that child will hop to you like a bunny.
- 2. Continue until each child has a turn to move like their animal.
- 3. Repeat as desired.

After the Activity

Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

""Hello friends! Gather over here on this wall. I'm going to put a sticker on everyone's hand. Here's one for you, (PAUSE) look! It's a/an [ANIMAL]. And a sticker for you. (PAUSE.) You got a/an [ANIMAL]! (CONTINUE WITH EACH CHILD.) Today, we are going to play a game where I name an animal and if you have that animal sticker, you'll move to me like that animal!"

During the Activity

"Are all my animals ready to play? Great! Listen for your animal. Elephants! Stomp over to me. (PAUSE.) Awesome! Okay, bunny rabbits, hop over to me. (PAUSE.) Fantastic! (CONTINUE UNTIL EACH CHILD MOVES TO YOU LIKE THEIR ANIMAL.) Wow, you all moved just like the animals I named! That was a fun game!"

After the Activity

"In our Bible Story, we learned that God brought each animal to Adam and whatever Adam called each animal, that was its name! God gave Adam and Eve really good things to do. God wanted them to take care of the world He made! And God gives us good things to do too! Like... Being kind and loving to everyone. Helping your neighbor. And taking care of the things God made. God had plans for Adam and Eve, and God has plans for you and me too! Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me!

Assist children, as needed.

Create an example.

Model and encourage children to construct and create their frame.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Copy "Craft Stick Frame Label" on label paper, one label per child.
- 2. Attach one VELCRO rough edge dot near each end of two craft sticks.
- Attach one VELCRO soft edge dot near the ends of the other two craft sticks.
- 4. Write each child's name on one of their craft sticks.

During the Activity

- Encourage children to decorate their craft sticks then clean hands as needed
- Ask children to add their label then connect their craft sticks to create a frame.

After the Activity

Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hello friends! Come over to the table. Today we are going to construct and create something super neat with these craft sticks."

During the Activity

"I want you to decorate your craft sticks with markers and stickers.

(PAUSE.) Wow! These look great! (CLEAN HANDS AS NEEDED.) Now let's put them together. See these dots? (POINT TO THE VELCRO DOTS.) Stick the craft sticks together with these dots. (PAUSE.) Great job! You made a picture frame! Did some of the decorated sides go on the back of your frame? (PAUSE.) That's okay! You can leave them like they are, or you can decorate the plain sides. (GIVE CHILDREN A CHANCE TO DECORATE MORE IF DESIRED.) There's one last piece for your frame, add this label on one of the craft sticks. (PAUSE.) It says [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me. And tells you where you can look in the Bible to find today's story. Great job friends."

After the Activity

"Today we heard a story from the Bible about the very first two people God made. Their names were Adam and Eve, and they lived in a beautiful garden. God gave Adam and Eve very important jobs to do like taking care of the garden and everything in it. That means taking care of the land and the plants and the animals, and growing food in the garden. God even asked Adam to name the animals! God gives us important jobs to do too because God has plans for you and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me."

- If a child is uncomfortable with movement, give them a role such as handing out the tape to friends or helping press the pieces onto the picture.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Copy "Hiding Baby Moses" on cardstock, one per Small Group.
- 2. Laminate "Hiding Baby Moses" and tape to the wall at child's height.
- 3. Tear off 3-inch pieces of tape and stick them around the room where children can easily find them.

During the Activity

- 1. Encourage children to search for pieces of tape around the room.
- When they find a piece, have them bring it to the picture of baby Moses and stick it on him.
- Continue until all the pieces of tape have been found and the picture is covered.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come look at this baby in a basket! This baby 's name is Moses, and we'll hear all about him in our Bible Story today."

During the Activity

"We need to hide him, maybe in some tall grass. Do you see any grass around the room? (PAUSE.) What about this? (WALK TO A PIECE OF GREEN TAPE AND REMOVE IT FROM THE WALL.) Let's try it! (TAKE THE PIECE OF TAPE AND PLACE IT ON THE PICTURE.) Wow! That looks like grass! Will you help me find more? Go look around the room and when you find a piece, go stick it on the picture. Let's go! (PAUSE.) Wow! You are doing a great job making sure baby Moses gets covered with the grass. Do you see any more grass we can add? (PAUSE.) There's some! Go grab it and we'll make sure baby Moses is safe and hidden in the grass. (PAUSE.) Great job! You did it!"

After the Activity

"Look at all the grass you found to hide baby Moses and keep him safe! In our Bible Story today, we are going to hear more about baby Moses and how God had a plan for him!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by pretending to hide in the grass. Ask kids to wiggle their fingers like grass in front of their faces.

Before the Activity

- 1. Cut construction paper in the shape of patches of grass, one per child and leader.
- 2. Space out on the floor and secure with Con-Tact paper.

During the Activity

- 1. Invite children to stand on one of the "grass" pieces.
- 2. Say the Memory Verse together as the children jump from "grass" patch to "grass" patch. Repeat the verse each time they jump.

After the Activity

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Come join me over here at the tall, tall grass. (POINT.) Let's say our Memory Verse together as we do the motions. Everyone ready? Here we go! "'For I know (TOUCH HEAD WITH FINGERTIPS) the plans I have for you,' (MARCH) says the Lord," (POINT UP) Jeremiah 29:11. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) Great job everyone!"

During the Activity

"Today, we heard about how Moses' mom trusted God and kept him safe in the tall grass by the river. Now, we're going to have some fun jumping from 'grass to grass' while we say our special verse! Find a patch of grass to stand on. (PAUSE.) When I say part of our Memory Verse, jump to the next grass patch! Let's all move in this direction. (POINT.) Ready? "'For I know. Everyone jump! (PAUSE.) The plans I have for you.' Everyone jump! (PAUSE.) Says the Lord." Everyone jump! (PAUSE.) Jeremiah 29:11. Everyone jump! (PAUSE.) Wow! Let's keep going! (REPEAT AS DESIRED.) Great job!"

After the Activity

"Moses' mom put him in a basket and hid him in the tall grass to keep him safe. She trusted God and knew that God had plans for her and for Moses. Our Memory Verse tells us that God has plans for us. That's right, God had plans for Moses and God has plans for you and you, and you, and me! Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me!"

 - → Clean hands as needed.
- Ask children to fold their handprint back together and add a label to the front.

After the Activity

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come sit at the table with me and let's create some story art."

During the Activity

"I traced each of your hands earlier on green paper and cut them out.

(HOLD UP ONE SET OF HANDPRINTS.) They look like grass. Open your handprint like this and glue baby Moses inside. (PAUSE.) Great job!

(CLEAN HANDS AS NEEDED.) Fold your handprints back together and add this label. (PAUSE.) It says [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me. And tells you where you can look in the Bible to find today's story."

After the Activity

"Today we heard a story from the Bible about a baby named Moses. He was an Israelite, one of God's people. Moses' mom wanted to keep him safe from the mean king who wanted to hurt all the baby Israelite boys. She made a basket, put Moses in it, and hid him in the tall grass by the river. A princess found Moses and decided to keep him safe. Miriam, Moses' sister, told the princess that she knew someone that could help take care of him. That was Moses' mom. She trusted God and knew God had plans for her and Moses. God had plans for Moses, and God has plans for you too! Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me."

Before the Activity

1. Put the crown on and ask children to join you in an open area.

During the Activity

2. Encourage children to follow your movements.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come over here with me. Look at my head. Do you know what I'm wearing? (TAP THE CROWN.) That's right! A crown. Kings and queens wear crowns. I'm going to pretend to be a king and we can play a game of follow the king!"

During the Activity

"When I am wearing the crown, wherever I go and whatever I do, I want you to follow me and try to do the same movement I do. Ready to give it a try? Follow the king, here we go! (CLAP YOUR HANDS.) Great clapping! Follow the king. (STOP CLAPPING, START MARCHING AROUND THE ROOM.) Whoa, great marching. (CONTINUE WITH DIFFERENT MOVEMENTS/ ACTIONS SUCH AS NODDING HEAD, PATTING LEGS, WIGGLING, PRETENDING TO READ A BOOK, TIP TOEING, ETC.) That was a fun game, and you were great at following the king!"

After the Activity

"In our Bible Story today, we're going to hear about a real king who followed God's plan, and he helped the people follow God's plan too. I can't wait to learn about the real king in today's true story from the Bible. Are you ready to go hear all about it? Let's go!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by continuing to play follow the king!



Inclusive Pro Tips

For version with less movements, sit on the floor with children and do stationary movements.

Use simple, clear language and visual cues.

King Josiah was so happy to hear God's words, he told all the people to come so they could hear God's words too! After everyone had heard God's words, King Josiah and all the people promised to follow God's plans because God's plans are best! (POINT OUT THE BIBLE BLOCK IF CHILDREN DON'T BRING ATTENTION TO IT.) Look! You found a Bible when you were building, just like King Josiah!"

After the Activity

"We can read the Bible to hear God's words and hear the plans God has for us. So when I ask, who has plans for you, I want you to say, [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me! Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me! God had plans for King Josiah and God has plans for you too! Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me!"

What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, when you construct and create, you need special tools. I have a hammer, a tape measure, and a paint brush for you to decorate then you can build a tool belt to put them in. I'm so excited to create these with you today as we review our Bible Story."

During the Activity

"Your tools have special words on them. The words on your hammer (HOLD UP A HAMMER) say [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me. The words on your tape measure say "'For I know the plans I have for you,' says the Lord." Jeremiah 29:11. Hey that's the Memory Verse we're learning! And the words on your paintbrush say [BASIC TRUTH] God loves me. You can create a lot of good, good things with these special tools. Use the markers to decorate your tools. (PAUSE.) Wow! These are fantastic! Now decorate this paper strip and these little pockets. (PAUSE.) Glue the three pockets to your paper strip, make sure all the pockets have the openings facing up. (ASSIST AS NEEDED.) Everyone add this label to one of the pockets. (PAUSE.) The words on this label tell you where you can look in the Bible to find today's story about King Josiah. I'm going to measure the strip around your waist because that's where you wear a tool belt! (MEASURE AND ADHERE THE VELCRO DOTS TO EACH CHILD'S BELT.) How cool! Now add one tool to each pocket. (PAUSE.) You look like you are ready to review our story about King Josiah, let's listen."

After the Activity

"In our Bible Story today, we learned about a young boy named Josiah who had an important job. Josiah was a king! He kept the people safe and helped them know the right things to do. King Josiah loved God and wanted to follow God's plans. One day, King Josiah decided to repair the temple so the people could go and worship God. While the people were working, someone found a very special book. This book was the most special book because it had God's words in it! King Josiah wanted EVERYONE to hear God's words! After King Josiah and all the people heard God's words, everyone promised to follow God's plans because God's plans are best! God had plans for King Josiah and God has plans for you too. Who has plans for you? [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for me."



For a version with less movement, sit children in a circle on the floor and when the timer goes off, encourage children to wave their arms, clap their hands, or rock from side to side.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Gather children around you and show them the timer you will be using and explain what it does.

During the Activity

- 1. Set the timer for a few seconds and slowly work up to more time.
- 2. Ensure that the sound for the timer is turned on.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come over here and stand with me. I want to show this cool timer. (SHOW THE KITCHEN TIMER OR PHONE APP.) A timer counts down time and then it makes a sound, you can use it for lots of different things but today we are going to use it to play a game."

During the Activity

"Would you like to hear what the timer sounds like before we start our game? (SET THE TIMER FOR A SECOND.) Okay, when the timer stops this is what it sounds like. (PAUSE.) Wow! That's a loud sound. Okay I think we are ready to play! I'm going to set the timer for longer this time, and while it counts down, we have to wait. We can't do anything, we have to be still and wait. Then when we hear the timer go off and make that loud sound, we can dance and move our bodies all around. (SET THE TIMER.) Wait... (PAUSE.) Hear that sound? It means our waiting time is over. Everybody move and dance around! (PAUSE.) Now freeze and we'll set the timer again. (CONTINUE INCREASING THE TIME YOU SET.) Great job friends!"

After the Activity

"Waiting is really hard sometimes isn't it. But you did it! After we waited we had so much fun dancing and moving together! Today in our Bible Story, we are going to learn about a man named Abraham and his wife and how they waited and waited for God's plan because they knew that God always keeps His promises! Let's go hear what God had planned for Abraham and Sarah!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by setting the timer to see how far they can walk before the timer sounds. Continue until you reach your designated area. (BE SURE TO TURN YOUR TIMER OFF BEFORE ENTERING WORSHIP AND STORY.)

Come wait for the rest of our friends with me. [CHILD'S NAME] your turn! Crawl through the tunnel to me! (PAUSE.) Hooray! You made it! (CONTINUE WITH EACH CHILD.) Whoa, we did a lot of waiting today. We had to wait for our turn to go through the tunnel and then we waited for all our friends to have a turn. We waited, and waited, and waited."

After the Activity

"In our Bible Story today we learned about a young man named Abraham and his wife, Sarah. One night, God told Abraham, "Look up at the sky. Count the stars, if you can. That's how many children will be born into your family." (GENESIS 15:5 NIRV) Wow, that's a big family! Abraham and Sarah were excited about God's plan, and they knew that God always keeps His promises. Abraham and Sarah were ready to have a baby and start their family.
