1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Invite children to sit at the table with you.
- 2. Optional: Place smiley face stickers on each child's fingers to represent family members.

During the Activity

- 1. Lead children to use their fingers as they play along with the song
- 2. Repeat as desired.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come sit at the table with me. (PAUSE.) Today we're going to learn about families while we play a game moving our fingers to a song!"

During the Activity

"Follow me and do what I do. Let's meet each member of this family... (LEAD THROUGH FINGERPLAY).

"This is Mama, kind and dear (WIGGLE THUMB)

This is Papa, standing near (WIGGLE POINTER)

This is brother, see how tall (WIGGLE MIDDLE FINGER)

This is sister, not so small (WIGGLE RING FINGER)

This is baby, sweet and cute (WIGGLE PINKY)

These are the family, who love to help YOU! (WIGGLE ALL FINGERS.)

"Great job! Families come in all shapes and sizes. Tell me some people in your family and we'll do our fingerplay again with them. (PAUSE FOR RESPONSES.) Let's try it together! You were so good at following along!

"This is Grandma, kind and dear (WIGGLE THUMB)

This is Uncle, standing near (WIGGLE POINTER)

This is auntie, see how tall (WIGGLE MIDDLE FINGER)

This is cousin, not so small (WIGGLE RING FINGER)

This is puppy, sweet and cute (WIGGLE PINKY)

These are the family, who love to help YOU!" (WIGGLE ALL FINGERS.)

(CHANGE OUT THE DIFFERENT PEOPLE IN THE FAMILY AND REPEAT AS DESIRED.)




After the Activity

"Today's true story from the Bible is about a woman named Naomi. She went back to her hometown and had someone special go with her. That someone was family-and we're going to hear more about how they helped each other."

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by continuing the activity and saying "Let's continue to sing and play as we walk, sing the original or one of the adapted versions. ② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come stand with me, and let me tell you our brand-new Memory Verse! Ready to hear it? It goes like this. 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD (POINT UP) with my whole heart,' (TAP HEART TWICE) Psalm 111:1." (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.)

Set out the picture cutouts made from the "Memory Verse Hand Motions" PDF for children to hold up or point to as an alternative to saying or repeating the verse out loud.

② What You Say (cont.)

During the Activity

"Now, let's learn the motions. The first part of our verse says: 'I will give thanks.' (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN.) Make your hand flat and put your fingertips on your chin like this. (PLACE YOUR RIGHT HAND UP TO YOUR FACE WITH YOUR FINGERTIPS RESTING ON YOUR CHIN.) Now bring your flat hand out from your face like this (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) and say, 'I will give thanks.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'To the LORD.' (POINT UP.) Put one finger up and stretch it up over your head like this (POINT UP) and say 'to the LORD.' (PAUSE.) Now let's put that together. 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD.' (POINT UP.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: "With my whole heart.' (TAP HEART TWICE.) Cross your right hand over your chest and tap your heart two times like this (REACH RIGHT HAND OVER CHEST AND TAP HEART TWICE) and say 'with my whole heart.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Nice job! Now let's put that together. 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD (POINT UP) with my whole heart.' (TAP HEART TWICE.) Super!

"Now the last part is: Psalm 111:1. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Put your hands together in front of you and open them like you are opening a book (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) and say: Psalm 111:1. (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job! I think we are ready to do it all together! Ready friends? 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD (POINT UP) with my whole heart,' (TAP HEART TWICE) Psalm 111:1. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Nice job. Let's do it again!" (REPEAT SEVERAL TIMES.)

After the Activity

"The Bible teaches us that we can thank God for everything with our whole heart! That means family, friends, food, and people who help us! We can thank God for everything! Who can thank God for everything?

[BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Put small pieces of tape, one per child, on the floor around the perimeter of your activity area.
- 2. Encourage children to stand on one of the pieces of tape.

During the Activity

- 1. Walk around the activity area, stopping at each tape piece to ask each child to join the train.
- 2. The first child will hold on to the leader's waist or hand and the other children added will hold the shoulders of the child in front of them.
- 3. The "train" proceeds to the next piece of tape and adds the next child to the train.
- 4. Continue until all children have joined the train and you've moved around your area a few times.
- 5. Repeat as desired.

Before the Activity

"Friends! Chugga-chugga, choo-choo, it's great to see you! There are little pieces of tape on the floor around our activity area. Please find a piece of tape to stand on. One friend for each piece of tape."

During the Activity

"We're going to play the train game! I'm the engine, and I need to add all the train cars—that's you! I'll move around, and when I stop at your tape, I want you to join the train. Then we'll go add another friend until we've added all our friends to our train! Are you ready? Chugga-chugga, choochoo, here I come! Who will go with me? (STOP AT A PIECE OF TAPE.)

[CHILD'S NAME], will you go with me? Great! Hold on to my waist/hand, and let's chugga-chugga to another friend! [CHILD'S NAME], will you go with us? Great! Hold on to [CHILD'S NAME]'s shoulders and chugga-chugga! Here we go! (CONTINUE UNTIL ALL CHILDREN HAVE BEEN ADDED.)

All right friends, it's time for our train to pull into the station. Everyone, have a seat right where you are."

After the Activity

"That was so much fun, pretending to be a train and chugga-chugging all around the room. Thank you for going with me on our journey! In today's true story from the Bible, we learned about a woman named Naomi. Naomi decided to go back to the town where she grew up and Ruth went with her. Ruth was married to Naomi's son, and she said, "I'm your family, Naomi! Wherever you go, I will go. Wherever you live, I will live." (RUTH 1:16) Naomi was so happy that she and Ruth were family, and she had someone to walk with her.

"When they got to town, they were hungry so Ruth found a field nearby and picked some grain so they would have food to eat. This field belonged to a man named Boaz; Naomi was part of his family! Boaz took care of Ruth and Naomi and made sure they had plenty of food to eat!

"God gives us people to call family and all families can take care of each other. Thank You, God, for giving us family and friends who are life family! Thank You, God, for everything. Who can you thank for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come join me at the table and let's make some story art to help us remember we can thank God for everything!"

During the Activity

"On your paper are stalks of grain. Use the crayons to color the stalk and the grain. These big circles, leave them blank and we'll add to those in a bit. (PAUSE.) Okay! Look at this circle. (POINT TO THE FIRST CIRCLE.) It has one dot in it. Put this sticker of Naomi in it. (PAUSE.) Naomi was sad because her husband and sons had died, and she was all alone.

"This next circle has two dots in it. (POINT TO THE SECOND CIRCLE.) That's where the sticker of Naomi and Ruth goes. (PAUSE.) Naomi decided to go back to the town where she grew up and Ruth went with her. Ruth said, "I'm your family, Naomi! Wherever you go, I will go. Wherever you live, I will live" (RUTH 1:16). Naomi was so happy that she and Ruth were family, and she had someone to walk with her. Ruth and Naomi took care of each other.

"This circle here has three dots on it. (POINT.) That's where the sticker of Ruth picking grain goes. (PAUSE.) Ruth and Naomi were hungry so Ruth found a field nearby and picked some grain for them to eat.

"This field belonged to a man named Boaz. And Naomi was part of his family! Boaz decided to take care of Ruth and Naomi and made sure they had plenty of food to eat! This sticker goes in the very last circle. (PAUSE.) Great job!"

After the Activity

"God gave Naomi family to help her. Then God sent more family to help. Thank You, God! God gives us people to call family too. All families can take care of each other. Thank You, God, for giving us family! Thank You, God for everything. Who can you thank for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] L can thank God for everything."

1 What You Do

After the Activity

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hello friends! Today, we're going to play a game about the fun things friends do. We'll take turns pulling a card from this container/bag. I'm so glad we're friends and we get to learn and play together!"

During the Activity

"Okay, it's our friend [CHILD'S NAME]'s turn to pick a card. (PAUSE.) Look! These friends are dancing, 'Friends can dance together!' Let's all dance! Go, go, go! You all are amazing dancers! Let's see what else friends can do! (CONTINUE UNTIL EACH CHILD HAS A TURN. ACTIONS ARE READING, GIVING A HIGH-FIVE, PLAYING, RUNNING, AND SHARING A SNACK. REPEAT AS DESIRED.) You all did such a great job playing together and trying all those fun friend actions."

After the Activity

"Our Bible Story today is about something else that friends can do. Let's get ready to hear all about what a guy named Daniel and his friends did together."

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by walking like you are going to see a King!

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"I need some friends to help me put these puzzles together. Can you help me?"

During the Activity

(START WITH THE KING NEBUCHADNEZZAR PUZZLE.) "Look! It's the king from our Bible Story. The king had a dream and needed help. He was angry because no one could help him.

(WORK THE DANIEL PUZZLE SECOND.) "This puzzle has Daniel on it. Daniel went to the king and said he could help him if he would give him some time, and the king said yes.

(WORK THE SHADRACH, MESHACH, ABEDNEGO, AND DANIEL PUZZLE

NEXT.) "Aww...this one is of Daniel's friends! Daniel went to his friends Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego and asked them to pray for him. And they did!

(WORK THE KING NEBUCHADNEZZAR AND DANIEL PUZZLE LAST.) "This puzzle is the end of our story. Daniel thanked God for telling him how to help the king. Then Daniel went to the king and helped him understand what his dream meant.

"That was fun! Let's mix up the pieces and work the puzzles again!"

After the Activity

"Thank you for helping me put these puzzles together! You are such good friends. Daniel had good friends who helped him too. We can thank God for our friends, because we can thank God for everything. Who can thank God for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything!"

② What You Say (cont)

Before the Activity

"Friends! Come join me at the table. I have something for you to make that will help you remember today's true story from the Bible. You can place it on your table at home."

During the Activity

"Look at your paper and point to the section with Daniel and his friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. (PAUSE.) Daniel asked his friends to pray. The friends prayed and talked to God and asked God to help. (DANIEL 2:17,18) Color that part of your paper. (PAUSE.)

"This part (POINT) says, 'I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart.' Psalm 111:1. Decorate it with stamps and stickers. (PAUSE.) These are looking great! There is one more section and the words on this page say [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything. Draw a picture of you and a friend on this part. (PAUSE.) Wow, fantastic!

"Now we get to fold it to make it stand. (ASSIST EACH CHILD AS NEEDED.)
Let's rub some glue along the tab and press it together to keep the ends together. (ASSIST EACH CHILD AS NEEDED.) See how it stands? Turn it around to see all the sides!"

After the Activity

"In today's true story from the Bible, we learned about a wise man named Daniel. He worked for King Nebuchadnezzar helping the king know what to do.

"When the king had a dream that worried him, he asked his wise men to help him understand it. But they didn't know what it meant, and this made the king angry. Daniel knew that only God could help. So he asked his friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to pray to God for help. God showed Daniel how to help the king! (DANIEL 2:19) Daniel told the king all about his dream and what it meant. (DANIEL 2:27-45) The king was so thankful to know what his dream meant.

"God gave Daniel really good friends. God gives us friends too. We can pray for our friends and ask them to pray for us too. We can thank God for our friends, and for everything! Who can you thank for everything?

[BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."

- 1. Copy "Dancing Ribbons Label" on label paper, one label per child.
- 2. Cut ribbons into 16-inch lengths, five per child.
- 3. Write each child's name on a craft stick.

During the Activity

- Encourage children to pick five ribbons of any color and stack them together.
- 2. Thread the stack through the rubber band and knot.
- Wrap each child's rubber band around one end of their craft stick until secure.
- Encourage children to decorate their craft stick with their label and stickers.

After the Activity

Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hooray! I'm so glad you're here! Come join me at the table. I have something fun for you to make today! It's a ribbon dancer that you can wave and dance and praise God with!"

During the Activity

"Look at all these pretty colored ribbons! You can pick any five ribbons for your dancer. They can be all the same color or different. (COUNT AS THE CHILDREN PICK THEIR RIBBONS TO MAKE SURE THEY GET FIVE.) Great job! Now let's thread them through the rubber band like this (DEMONSTRATE.) Then we need to tie them in a knot. (DEMONSTRATE.) HELP AS NEEDED.) Next, I'll wrap the rubber band around your craft stick several times, so the ribbons stay put. (PAUSE.) Ta-dah! (SHAKE THE RIBBON DANCER.) Put this sticker on your craft stick. It says, [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything. Finish decorating your stick with any of these other stickers. (PAUSE.) Great job! Hold them still and we'll use them after we review."

After the Activity

"Today we learned about a king named David. David loved God, and he wanted to praise God to show Him he was thankful for everything. David danced to praise God. David used his voice to praise God and David used instruments to praise God. You can praise God by playing an instrument, singing, or dancing too! There are all kinds of ways we can praise God and say, Thank You, God, for everything. Wave your rainbow dancer and say, Thank You, God, for everything. (WITH CHILDREN.) Thank You, God, for everything. Who can you thank for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."
