What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Spread out a picnic blanket on the floor in an open area of your room
- 2. Set the toy food and supplies nearby.

During the Activity

- 1. Invite children to help you pack for a picnic trip.
- 2. Encourage children to pick items they think would be fun or helpful to bring on a trip and place them in the basket.
- Once the basket is packed, invite children to pretend they are going on a trip with their family.
- Walk around the room or area together with the basket and stop and sit at the blanket.
- 5. Unpack the basket and enjoy the picnic together.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hi friends! Let's get ready to go on a picnic! Let's think of yummy food and things we might need. Will you help me find the things we need and pack our picnic basket? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSES.) Fantastic! Let's go!"

During the Activity

"You're doing a great job finding all sorts of wonderful things for our picnic! Pack it all in our basket. Do you think we got enough food? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSES.) Should we get a little more? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSES.) Great! Pack it up! (PAUSE.) I'm not sure we can fit much more into our picnic basket! Let's close it up and get ready to find the perfect picnic spot! (LEAD CHILDREN AROUND THE ROOM AND STOP AT THE PICNIC BLANKET.) Oh look, we found it, the perfect picnic spot! Let's sit and unpack our basket. (PAUSE.) We can share what's inside! (TALK ABOUT EACH OF THE THINGS YOU UNPACK.) Wow! We had a wonderful picnic! You helped me pack our food, go on trip to find our picnic spot, and then we shared all the wonderful food! Thank you for making our picnic so nice!"

After the Activity

"Friends, today in our Bible Story, we'll hear about a family that went on trip just like we did! Let's get ready to listen and find out what happened on their trip and how they helped take care of each other!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by pretending to carry our picnic baskets.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come stand with me, and let me tell you our brand-new Memory Verse! Ready to hear it? It goes like this. 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD (POINT UP) with my whole heart,' (TAP HEART TWICE) Psalm 111:1." (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.)

Set out the picture cutouts made from the "Memory Verse Hand Motions" PDF for children to hold up or point to as an alternative to saying or repeating the verse out loud.

② What You Say (cont.)

During the Activity

"Now, let's learn the motions. The first part of our verse says: 'I will give thanks.' (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN.) Make your hand flat and put your fingertips on your chin like this. (PLACE YOUR RIGHT HAND UP TO YOUR FACE WITH YOUR FINGERTIPS RESTING ON YOUR CHIN.) Now bring your flat hand out from your face like this (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) and say, 'I will give thanks.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'To the LORD.' (POINT UP.) Put one finger up and stretch it up over your head like this (POINT UP) and say 'to the Lord.' (PAUSE.) Now let's put that together. 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD.' (POINT UP.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: "With my whole heart.' (TAP HEART TWICE.) Cross your right hand over your chest and tap your heart two times like this (REACH RIGHT HAND OVER CHEST AND TAP HEART TWICE) and say 'with my whole heart.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Nice job! Now let's put that together. 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD (POINT UP) with my whole heart.' (TAP HEART TWICE.) Super!

"Now the last part is: Psalm 111:1. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Put your hands together in front of you and open them like you are opening a book (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) and say: Psalm 111:1. (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job! I think we are ready to do it all together! Ready friends? 'I will give thanks (MOVE FLAT HAND FORWARD FROM CHIN) to the LORD (POINT UP) with my whole heart,' (TAP HEART TWICE) Psalm 111:1. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Nice job. Let's do it again!" (REPEAT SEVERAL TIMES.)

After the Activity

"The Bible teaches us that we can thank God for everything with our whole heart! That means family, friends, food, and people who help us! We can thank God for everything! Who can thank God for everything?

[BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."

Repeat or model the phrase for children who may need language support.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

- 1. Gather the children in a circle or seated side-by-side.
- Explain that you're going to play a special game where they pass a thankful message quietly to one another.

During the Activity

- Whisper to the child seated next to you, "I can thank God for...
 [something simple, like my family]," and have that child whisper it to
 the next child, and so on.
- 2. When it gets to the last child, encourage them to say the message out loud.
- 3. Celebrate if the message made it all the way around clearly or laugh together if it got a little silly!
- Invite the next child in the circle to start a new thankful message, and repeat.
- 5. Talk about how it's fun to share what we're thankful for.

After the Activity

Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come sit with me on the floor in a circle. I have a fun game for us to play to help us practice saying thank you to God!"

During the Activity

"I'm going to whisper something I can thank God for into [CHILD'S NAMEI's ear, then they'll whisper it to the next friend, and we'll keep going around the circle until it gets to our friend [CHILD'S NAME ON YOUR OTHER SIDE]. Let's see if what I say makes it all the way around the circle! Ready? (WHISPER I CAN THNK GOD FOR FAMILY.) Did you get it? Okay turn and whisper it to the friend next to you. (CONTINUE UNTIL IT MAKES IT ALL THE WAY AROUND.) Okay, [CHILD'S NAME], tell us what the message was. (PAUSE FOR RESPONSE. THEN CELEBRATE IF CORRECT OR GIGGLE IF THE MESSAGE GOT SILLY.) That was fun! Now it's [CHILD'S NAME] to start the message. (CONTINUE UNTIL EACH CHILD HAS A TURN TO SHARE A MESSAGE.) That was fun and a little silly to share what we're thankful for in our game today!"

After the Activity

"Today we heard a true story from the Bible about Ruth, Naomi, and Boaz! We learned how they were family and helped each other. God gave Naomi someone to love her and help her. And you know what? God gives us people, too! We can thank God for everything and everyone He gives us. Who can thank God for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything!"

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come to the table and let's make some story art to help us remember today's true story from the Bible."

During the Activity

"Look on your paper. I see Ruth in Boaz's field collecting grain for her and Naomi. Color your paper and then we'll add something special to it. (PAUSE.) Great job! Now let's glue some of this cereal in the field and in a pile next to Ruth. (PAUSE.) Great job friends! Now, here's a little extra cereal to eat as a snack. (PASS OUT ADDITIONAL CEREAL.) Let's thank God for our snack. Say it with me. Thank You, God, for our friends, our food, and for everything. (WITH CHILDREN.) Thank You, God, for our friends, our food, and for everything."

After the Activity

"God gave Naomi family like Ruth and Boaz to help her. Ruth walked with Naomi to her hometown and found food for them to eat in Boaz's field. When Boaz found out that Naomi was part of his family, he decided to make sure they had plenty of food to eat. God gives us people to call family and all families can take care of each other. Thank You, God, for giving us family! Thank You, God, for everything! Who can thank God for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."

"Let's get ready to move! Watch the noodle and do what it does. If I shake the noodle like this, (SHAKE THE NOODLE BACK AND FORTH) show me how shake your body. (PAUSE.) Great job! Everyone freeze and watch the noodle! (BEND THE NOODLE.) Can you bend your body like the noodle? (PAUSE.) Way to go! Okay and now freeze! (CONTINUE WITH DIFFERENT MOVEMENTS.) That was so much fun moving like the noodle!"

After the Activity

"Today in our true Bible Story, we are going to hear about a man named Daniel and his good friends that prayed and talked to God for him. Let's go hear all about Daniel and his friends!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by asking children to continue to move your body different ways.

Before the Activity

"Hey, everyone! Come stand in front of me! You are going to be my mirror!"

"Daniel's job was to help the king. (PUT A PRETEND CROWN ON YOUR HEAD.)

"One night, the king had a dream. (PRETEND TO GO TO SLEEP.)

"When the king woke up, he needed help. (WAKE UP AND STRETCH.)

"The king got angry when no one could help him. (MAKE ANGRY FACE.)

"Daniel went to his friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego.

(WALK IN PLACE.)

"Daniel asked his friends to pray, and they did. (PRAYING HANDS.)

"God helped Daniel know how to help the king. (TAP YOUR POINTER FINGER TO YOUR TEMPLE.)

"Daniel prayed and thanked God for helping him. (PRAYING HANDS.)

"Then, Daniel ran to the king and helped him! (RUN IN PLACE.)

"Yay, God! Yay, friends! (CLAP AND CHEER.)

"Great job, everyone!" (REPEAT AS TIME AND INTEREST ALLOW.)

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Let's make some story puppets to help us remember today's true story about Daniel and his friends."

During the Activity

"These clothespins will be our puppets. You need to decorate one like the king, and give him a crown. (PAUSE.) Decorate another clothespin to be Daniel and the other three to be Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. (PAUSE.) These look great! Let's use them as we review our Bible Story.

"Today we learned about Daniel. Hold up your Danel puppet. (PAUSE.) Daniel loved God and was very wise. He listened to God and wanted to do what God said. Daniel was one of King Nebuchadnezzar's (HOLD UP YOUR KING PUPPET) wise men. His job was to help the king know what to do.

"One night, the king had a dream that worried him, and he wanted his wise men to help him understand it. The wise men didn't know what the dream meant, and that made the king angry. Walk your king puppet around like he's mad. Daniel went to his friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego (HOLD UP THE THREE OTHER PUPPETS) and asked them to pray. And they did! (PUT THE SHADRACH, MESHACH, AND ABEDNEGO PUPPETS DOWN.) Later that night, God showed Daniel how to help the king! (DANIEL 2:19) Daniel thanked God for knowing everything and being wiser than anyone else! Then Daniel went to the king and told him that God could help him. (HOLD UP THE KING AND DANIEL PUPPETS.) Daniel told the king all about his dream and what it meant (DANIEL 2:27-45). The king was so thankful to know what his dream meant. Put your puppets in this bag with this paper, and close it up."

After the Activity

"God gave Daniel really good friends. God gives us friends, too. We can ask our friends to pray for us, and we can pray for them. We can thank God for our friends because we can thank God for everything!

For a version with less movement, sit with children around the umbrella and toss the pom-poms in.

Pair children up to do the activity.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Scatter pom-poms on the floor in an open area of your room.

During the Activity

- Open the umbrella and place it upside down on the floor in the middle of your area.
- 2. Ask the children to collect as many pom-poms as they can and throw them into the umbrella.
- 3. Once all the pom-poms have been collected and thrown into the umbrella, encourage the children to stand closely around you.
- Then lift the umbrella over everyone's head and let the manna fall out.
- 5. Repeat as desired.



(PAUSE.) Turn your book to the back and and draw a picture of someone who helps you because we can thank God for people who help us. (PAUSE.) Your thankful books turned out so nice."

After the Activity

"We can praise God like King David did to thank God for everything! Praising God is thanking God for who He is and what He has done!

"We can sing, shout, dance, and play instruments to thank God for family, friends, food, and people who help us. We can thank God for everything! There are all kinds of ways we can praise God and say, 'Thank You, God, for everything.' Who can thank God for everything? [BOTTOM LINE] I can thank God for everything."
