② What You Say

- 2. Clean hands as needed.

② What You Say

"Look at your paper, there's the woman and her husband who helped Elisha! They would give him food to eat when he came to town. But they wanted to help Elisha even more! So they made a room on top of their house with a chair, a table, a lamp, and a bed so Elisha could come and rest. Let's add Elisha's room to the top of their house. (HELP RUB GLUE ON THE BACK OF THE CUTOUT AND HELP POSITION IT ON TOP OF THE HOUSE.) Now pat it down to help it stick. (PAUSE.) Great job! Elisha thanked God for the people who helped him. You can thank God for the people who help you, too. [BOTTOM LINE] You can thank God for everything."

(PAUSE.) Great job! (CLEAN HANDS AS NEEDED.) You can put it on the light switch in your room, and remember that [BOTTOM LINE] You can thank God for everything. You can thank God for your room, the food you eat, family and friends, people who help you...EVERYTHING! In our true story from the Bible, Elisha thanked God for the people who helped him."

1 What You Do

→ Gather children on a rug or in a specific area of the classroom to tell the story.

② What You Say

"Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come join me on the floor. Today's true story from the Bible (HOLD UP THE BIBLE) begins with a man named Elisha. (DRAW A STICK FIGURE ELISHA.) Elisha loved God (DRAW A BIG RED HEART ON ELISHA) and traveled all over, telling people about God. (DRAW LOTS OF STICK FIGURES AROUND ELISHA.)

"In one town, (DRAW SEVERAL SIMPLE HOUSE/RECTANGLE SHAPES) there was a woman and her husband (DRAW A STICK FIGURE WOMAN AND MAN NEXT TO ONE OF THE HOUSES) who wanted to help Elisha, (DRAW ELISHA NEXT TO THE MAN AND WOMAN) so she and her husband would have him come to their house to eat. (DRAW A SIMPLE TABLE IN FRONT OF THEM AND ADD SOME SIMPLE FOOD SHAPES.) But they wanted to do more to help Elisha, so they built a room for him on top of their house. (DRAW A SIMPLE SQUARE/RECTANGLE ON THEIR HOUSE.) They gave him a chair (DRAW A CHAIR), a table (DRAW A TABLE), a lamp (DRAW A LAMP), and a bed (DRAW A BED). Elisha was so thankful that God gave him people to help him. God gives you people to help you, too! You can thank God for the people who help you because [BOTTOM LINE] You can thank God for everything."

② What You Say

"Look! It's Elisha's room! Let's look at all the things in his room. The woman put things in Elisha's room that she thought he would need, like a chair to sit in. (POINT.) Put a heart stamp on the chair. (PAUSE.) The woman also wanted Elisha to have a table (POINT) in his room so he could write there. Put a heart stamp on the table. (PAUSE.) She also wanted to give Elisha a lamp (POINT) in his room so he could see in the dark. Put a heart stamp on the lamp. (PAUSE.) The woman also put a bed (POINT) in the room so he could sleep. Put a heart stamp on the bed. (PAUSE.) So, whenever Elisha needed a place to rest, he would come to the room at their house. Elisha thanked God for the people who helped him. You can thank God for the people who help you, too. [BOTTOM LINE] You can thank God for everything."

"Elisha loved God and traveled all over, telling people about God. (WALK THE ELISHA FIGURE AROUND.) In one town, there was a woman and her husband (PLACE THE WOMAN AND MAN FIGURE NEXT TO THE HOUSE) who helped Elisha by giving him food to eat. (WALK ELISHA UP TO THE PEOPLE AND PUT A PIECE OF FOOD IN FRONT OF THEM.) But they wanted to do more to help him, so they built a room for him on top of their house! (PLACE THE ROOM BOX ON TOP OF THE HOUSE BOX.) She gave him a chair, a table, a lamp, and a bed so he had a place to rest when he was in town. Elisha thanked God for the people who helped him.

Put this in Elisha's room. (PAUSE.) This is his table. (PICK UP THE TABLE CUTOUT.) Put this in Elisha's room. (PAUSE.) This is his chair. (PICK UP THE CHAIR CUTOUT.) Put this in Elisha's room.
