Inclusive Pro Tips

Offer different ways to participate, like pointing to a shield instead of picking it up or naming the person on the shield.

Pair children up to find shields together, allowing them to help one another and making the activity more accessible for kids who may need extra guidance.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- Copy "Brave Shield Hunt" on cardstock and cut one set per Small Group.
- 2. Attach each image to the center of a plate.
- 3. Glue the mirror paper to the center of the sixth plate.
- 4. Cut cardstock widthwise into 11/2" strips, six per Small Group.
- Roll each strip and tape it to the back of each plate to create a handle for each shield.
- 6. Place the shields around the room in easy-to-find locations.

During the Activity

- 1. Invite the children to move around the room and find the shields.
- As they find each shield, name who is on it (firefighter, superhero, child, etc.).
- 3. Talk about how each shield has a brave person on it.
- 4. Reset and repeat as desired.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, today we are going to go on a hunt to find some very special shields! These shields have pictures of people who are super brave. When you find a shield, hold it up high and we'll talk about who is on it!"

During the Activity

"Ready, set, go! (PAUSE.) Raise the shield really high in the air when you find one. (PAUSE.) Wow! [CHILD'S NAME], you found one! Who is on your shield? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSES.) Wow! You found a firefighter! Firefighters are so brave because they help people in danger! Keep looking! I see more brave shields waiting to be found! [CHILD'S NAME], what brave shield did you find? (PAUSE FOR RESPONSES.) Wow! You found yourself! Yes! You can be super brave too! Let's keep going! (REPEAT UNTIL ALL SHIELDS ARE FOUND.) That was such a fun game! Way to go, friends! You found all the brave shields!"

After the Activity

"Firefighters are brave. Superheroes are brave. And you know what? You can be brave too! In our Bible Story today, we are going to hear about someone who had to be very brave. Let's go find out who it is!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by holding up imaginary shields.

Before the Activity

"Friends, come stand with me, and let me tell you our brand-new Memory Verse! Ready to hear it? It goes like this. 'Be strong and courageous.

(MUSCLE ARMS) Do not be afraid . . . (CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS) for the Lord your God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) goes with you,' (MARCH IN PLACE) Deuteronomy 31:6." (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.)

② What You Say (cont.)

During the Activity

"Now, let's learn the motions. The first part of our verse says: 'Be strong and courageous.' (MUSCLE ARMS.) Put both arms up and show me your muscles like this (BOTH ARMS OUT TO THE SIDE, BENT AT THE ELBOW AND FLEX) and say, 'Be strong and courageous.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'Do not be afraid . . .' (CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS.) Put your arms out in front of you, elbows bent, and one arm over the other. (PAUSE.) Now move your arms out to the side like this (ARMS IN FRONT OF YOU, STACKED ONE OVER THE OTHER THEN SWIFTLY MOVE THEM OUT TO YOUR SIDE) and say, 'Do not be afraid...' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Wonderful! Now let's put that together. 'Be strong and courageous. (MUSCLE ARMS) Do not be afraid . . . (CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS) Great job!

"The next part of our verse says: 'for the Lord your God.' (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN.) Put one hand up straight in front of you with your thumb almost touching your forehead like this. (STRAIGHT, FLAT HAND WITH THUMB AT YOUR FOREHEAD.) Then you move your hand straight down in front of you like this, (PULL DOWN) and say, 'for the Lord your God.' (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Nice job! Now let's put that together. 'Be strong and courageous. (MUSCLE ARMS) Do not be afraid ... (CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS) for the Lord your God.' (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN.)

"The next part of our verse says: 'goes with you.' (MARCH IN PLACE.)

March in place like this, (STAND IN ONE SPOT AND ALTERNATE LIFTING

ONE KNEE UP AT A TIME) and say, 'goes with you.' (REPEAT WITH

CHILDREN.) Nice job! Now let's put that together. 'Be strong and

courageous. (MUSCLE ARMS) Do not be afraid . . . (CROSS AND UNCROSS

HANDS) for the Lord your God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD,

PULL DOWN) goes with you," (MARCH IN PLACE)

"Now the last part is: Deuteronomy 31:6. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Put your hands together in front of you and open them like you are opening a book (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK) and say: Deuteronomy 31:6. (REPEAT WITH CHILDREN.) Great job! I think we are ready to do it all together! Ready friends? 'Be strong and courageous. (MUSCLE ARMS) Do not be afraid . . . (CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS) for the Lord your God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) goes with you," (MARCH IN PLACE) Deuteronomy 31:6. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Nice job. Let's do it again!" (REPEAT SEVERAL TIMES.)

After the Activity

"The Bible teaches us that we don't need to be afraid, that we can be strong and courageous because God is with us! [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave. Who can help you be brave? [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave."

Inclusive Pro Tips

For a version with less movement, sit children around the parachute and encourage them to shake it gently in place of walking into and out of the circle.

(1) What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Lay the parachute on the floor in an open area of your room.

During the Activity

- 1. Ask one child to sit in the center of the parachute while the other children stand around the edge and hold the handles.
- 2. When you say "Queen" ask children to walk the parachute up to the queen, say "God can help you be brave!"
- Then ask children to carefully walk back and place the parachute flat on the floor.
- Have the child in the middle move to the outer edge and a new child come sit in the center.
- 5. Continue with each child.

After the Activity

Connect the Bottom Line to the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come over and let's play a parachute game!"

During the Activity

"Everyone, come stand around the parachute, and I need [CHILD'S NAME] to come sit in the center of the parachute. They will be our king/ queen. (PAUSE.) Okay, now everyone standing around the parachute, pick up the handle and when I count to three, slowly walk the parachute in towards the middle where [CHILD'S NAME] is sitting. Ready? One, two, three. Everyone freeze and say this after me. God can help you be brave. (WITH CHILDREN.) God can help you be brave. Great job friends! Now slowly and carefully walk backwards to where we started. (PAUSE.) Place the parachute down on the ground and [CHILD'S NAME] will come out and [CHILD'S NAME] will be our new king/queen. (CONTINUE UNTIL EACH CHILD HAS A TURN.) That was fun getting to take turns being kings and queens!"

After the Activity

"Today in our Bible Story, we learned about a King and his queen, named Esther. Esther was one of God's people. One day, the king was tricked and made a decision that was going to hurt God's people. But the king didn't know Esther was a part of God's people. Esther asked God's people to pray and talk to God with her. Esther trusted that God could help her be brave, so she went and asked the king to keep God's people safe, and the king said yes! Everyone celebrated. Esther prayed, and God helped her be brave. And do you know what? You can pray, and God can help you be brave, too! Who can help you be brave? [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave."

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Come to the table and let's make a story picture of brave Queen Esther. We learned that being brave means doing the right thing...even when you feel afraid."

During the Activity

"Color your picture while I talk about today's Bible Story. Today we learned about a beautiful queen named Esther, and she was married to a very powerful king. Esther was a part of God's people, but the king didn't know that. One day, the king was tricked and made a decision that was going to hurt God's people. Esther needed to talk to the king, but no one could talk to the king unless he invited them. Esther needed to be brave, so she asked God's people to pray and talk to God with her. The people prayed together for three days. Esther trusted that God could help her be brave, so she went to the king and asked the king to keep God's people safe. The king said yes and everyone celebrated. Now that you've finished your picture, let's bend the sides backwards and tape the edges together. (HELP AS NEEDED.) Now your story picture can stand. Every time you look at your story picture of brave queen Esther, you can remember to be brave too!"

After the Activity

"God helped Esther be brave and God can help you be brave too. Who can help you be brave? [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave."

Build It Up, Knock It Down





What You Need

□ Building blocks

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

1. Set the blocks out in an open area and ask children to join you.

During the Activity

- 1. Encourage children to build towers and pyramids.
- 2. When the building is complete, count down from three and allow the children to knock it down.
- 3. Repeat as desired.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Friends, come join me at the blocks!"

During the Activity

"Let's work together and use all the blocks to build a pyramid, that's a tower that looks like a triangle. We can line up six blocks end to end. (PAUSE.) Now, stack more blocks on top of that first line, starting them a bit from the edge like this. (DEMONSTRATE.) Keep adding, making it go higher and higher. (PAUSE.) Wow, you built it so tall! I'm going to count and then we can knock it down! Ready? Three, two, one, knock it down! (PAUSE.) Okay, this time I want you to build several tall towers. (PAUSE.) Wow! Look at how tall the towers are! Here's the countdown. Three, two, one, knock it down! (REPEAT AS DESIRED.) Great job, friends! That was so fun."

After the Activity

"Today in our true story from the Bible, we're going to hear about a small boy named David, who knocked over a big giant named Goliath! I can't wait to hear all about it. Let's go!"

Transition → Move to Worship and Story by encouraging children to walk, then freeze and strike a superhero pose when you count to three. Continue until you get to your designated area.

(CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS) for the Lord your God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) goes with you," (MARCH IN PLACE) Deuteronomy 31:6. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Great job!"

During the Activity

"Let's sit at the table together. I have something for you to make that will help you remember that God can help you be brave. (HOLD UP A DOOR HANGER.) It has the words to our Memory Verse on it. Use the markers and stamps to decorate it. (PAUSE.) Wow! You did a great job with these. So when you get home you can hang it on a door knob and when you go in or out of the room, you can remember that God can help you be brave. Let's say our Memory Verse one more time and do the motions. Ready? 'Be strong and courageous. (MUSCLE ARMS) Do not be afraid . . . (CROSS AND UNCROSS HANDS) for the Lord your God (FLAT HAND WITH THUMB TO FOREHEAD, PULL DOWN) goes with you," (MARCH IN PLACE) Deuteronomy 31:6. (OPEN HANDS LIKE A BOOK.) Good job, everyone!"

After the Activity

"The Bible teaches us that God can help us be brave. We don't need to be afraid; we can be strong and courageous because God is with us! God can help you be brave and [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave. Who can help you be brave? [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave."

"Wow, the plush friend went with you through the tunnel. But the plush friend won't always be with you, but do you know who is always with you? God is always with you. No matter where you go, God is always with you, and God can help you be brave! Who can help you be brave? [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave."

For children who need extra support, point to or describe the cups as they explore, saying, "Let's try this one! Do you think Gideon is inside?" to encourage participation.

1 What You Do

Before the Activity

- Copy "Who's Hiding?" on cardstock and cut one cutout per Small Group.
- 2. Tape one picture to the inside of a plastic cup.
- 3. Place cups upside down all over the floor.

During the Activity

- Explain to the children that they are going to find Gideon, who is hiding in a hole (the cup).
- Encourage children to flip the cups over one by one until they find Gideon.
- 3. Reset, placing the Gideon cup in a new spot each time.
- 4. Repeat as desired.

After the Activity

Introduce the Bible Story.

② What You Say

Before the Activity

"Hello friends! Come stand with me over here. Today I have a fun game for us to play. We need to find Gideon! He's hiding in a hole. Let's pretend these cups are holes. When I say go, you 'll run and flip over one cup at a time until we find Gideon!"

During the Activity

"Ready, set, GO! (PAUSE.) Flip all the cups over, one cup at a time.

Let's reset the cups and play again! (REPEAT AS DESIRED.) That was fun looking for Gideon together!"

"Gideon hid in a hole because he was afraid. Let's pretend this cup is the hole Gideon was hiding in. (GIVE EACH CHILD A CUP AND A STICKER.) Can you add the story sticker to the side of your cup? The words on your label say [BOTTOM LINE] God can help me be brave. It also tells you where you can look in the Bible to find today's story. Now hold your Gideon, like this. Push up, then bring it down. Like this. (DEMONSTRATE.) We'll do this exercise three times. One. (PAUSE.) Two. (PAUSE.) Three. (PAUSE.) Put your weights by your side and let's say our verse together. 'Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid...for the Lord your God goes with you.' Deuteronomy 31:6. (REPEAT AS DESIRED.) You can put your weights on the floor. (PAUSE.) Wow friends! You are all so strong. That was fun being strong just like it says in our Memory Verse."
