# Story Time

#### **What You Need**

## 1 What You Do

→ Gather children on a rug or in a specific area of the classroom to tell the story.

## ② What You Say

"Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come join me on the floor. Today's true story from the Bible (HOLD UP THE BIBLE) begins with a baby named Moses. He was one of God's people.

"Moses' mom wanted to keep him safe from the mean ruler, Pharaoh, so she made a basket and put Moses in it. Moses' mom hid him in the tall grass by the river and Moses' sister watched to see what would happen. Someone found baby Moses, it was the Pharaoh's daughter, and she decided to keep Moses safe. Moses' mom trusted God and knew God had plans for Moses, and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you."

## 1 What You Do

#### **Before the Activity**

- 1. Copy "Tall Grass Handprints" on cardstock, one per child.
- 2. Write each child's name on their paper.
- Gather small groups of children around you at a table for toddler craft time

#### **During the Activity**

- Help children press and cover their hand with the ink and press it over baby Moses once or twice.
- 2. Clean hands as needed.

## ② What You Say

"Look on your paper, there's baby Moses! Moses' mother put him in a basket and hid him in some tall, tall grass to keep him safe from the mean Pharaoh. Let's make some grass to hide Moses in. Let's cover your hand with the green ink pad and press it on top of Moses. (HELP CHILDREN INK THEIR ENTIRE HAND AND PRESS IT ON THEIR PAPER OVER MOSES. CLEAN HANDS AS NEEDED.) Where's Moses? There he is hiding in the grass, safe and sound! God kept Moses safe because God had plans for Moses, and IBOTTOM LINE! God has plans for you."

## ① What You Do

→ Gather children on a rug or in a specific area of the classroom to tell the story.

## ② What You Say

"Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come join me on the floor. Today's true story from the Bible (HOLD UP THE BIBLE) begins with a baby, (HOLD UP A PICTURE OF BABY MOSES) his name is Moses. Say hi to Moses. (WITH CHILDREN.) Hi Moses! Moses was one of God's people.

"This is Moses' mom. (HOLD UP A PICTURE OF MOSES' MOM.) She wanted to keep him safe from the mean ruler, Pharaoh (HOLD UP A PICTURE OF THE MEAN PHARAOH), so she made a basket and put Moses in it. (HOLD UP THE PICTURE OF MOSES' MOM WITH MOSES IN THE BASKET.) Moses' mom hid him in the tall grass by the river (HOLD UP THE PICTURE OF MOSES IN THE BASKET IN THE TALL GRASS), and his sister watched to see what would happen. Someone found baby Moses; it was the Pharaoh's daughter (HOLD UP THE PICTURE OF PHARAOH'S DAUGHTER HOLDING MOSES), and she decided to keep him safe. Moses' mom trusted God and knew God had plans for Moses, and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you."

Press your finger on the ink pad then press it on your paper. (PAUSE.) Keep going until your frame is filled with lots and lots of little fingerprints. (PAUSE AND CLEAN HANDS.) [CHILD'S NAME] [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you. (CONTINUE WITH EACH CHILD.)"

## 1 What You Do

→ Gather children on a rug or in a specific area of the classroom to tell the story.

## ② What You Say

"Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come join me on the floor. Today's true story from the Bible (HOLD UP THE BIBLE) begins with a baby, (DRAW A SIMPLE SWADDLED BABY) hello baby! This baby's name is Moses, he was one of God's people.

"This is Moses' mom. (DRAW A SIMPLE STICK FIGURE WOMAN.) She wanted to keep him safe from the mean ruler, Pharaoh (DRAW A SIMPLE STICK FIGURE MAN WITH A CROWN TO THE LEFT OF MOSES' MOM), SO she made a basket and put Moses in it. (DRAW A SIMPLE BASKET SHAPE WITH A SIMPLE SWADDLED BABY INSIDE.) Moses' mom hid him in the tall grass by the river (DRAW GREEN MARKS OVER MOSES IN THE BASKET), and Moses' sister watched to see what would happen. (DRAW A SIMPLE STICK GIRL TO THE SIDE OF THE GRASS.) Someone found baby Moses; it was the Pharaoh's daughter (DRAW A SIMPLE STICK FIGURE GIRL WITH A CROWN HOLDING A BABY), and she decided to keep him safe. Moses' mom trusted God and knew God had plans for Moses, and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you."

## 1 What You Do

## ② What You Say

"Moses' mom wanted to keep baby Moses safe from the mean Pharoah, so she put him in a basket and hid him in the tall, tall grass. Look at all the tall grass on your paper, that's the perfect place to hide baby Moses! Let's rub some glue on the back of your picture then stick him in the grass. (HELP RUB GLUE ON THE BACK AND POSITION IT OVER THEIR PAPER. ALLOW CHILD TO STICK IT ON THEIR PAPER AND PAT IT DOWN.) Great job! (CLEAN HANDS AS NEEDED.) Moses' mom loved God and knew God had plans for her and Moses, and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you, too."

<b>Green Crepe Paper Streamers</b>
Toy or Paper Crown

## 1 What You Do

- 1. Gather children on a rug or in a specific area of the classroom to tell the story.
- 2. Cut streamers in 36-inches, four per group.
- Fold each streamer in half and tape each folded streamer to the handle of the basket.

## ② What You Say

"Hello, friends! I'm so glad to see you today. Come join me on the floor.

(PLACE ALL THE ITEMS IN FRONT OF YOU.) Today's true story from the Bible (HOLD UP THE BIBLE) begins with a baby (ROCK THE BABY), his name is Moses.

"Moses' mom wanted to keep him safe from the mean ruler, Pharaoh, so she made a basket and put Moses in it. (PUT THE BABY DOLL IN THE BASKET.) Moses' mom hid him in the tall grass by the river (MOVE THE STREAMERS OVER THE BASKET HIDING THE BABY) while his sister watched to see what would happen. Someone found baby Moses; it was the Pharaoh's daughter, (PLACE THE CROWN ON YOUR HEAD), and she decided to keep him safe. Moses' mom trusted God and knew God had plans for Moses, and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you."

# ② What You Say

"Can you point to baby Moses on your paper? (PAUSE.) There he is! See these lines? (POINT TO THE GRASS OUTLINES.) Use the marker to fill them in so they can become the tall, tall grass and hide baby Moses. (PAUSE.) Great job! Moses' mom hid him in the tall, tall grass to keep him safe because she knew that God had plans for him and [BOTTOM LINE] God has plans for you."
