General Short-Term Information

What is a Short-Term Mission with Global Gates?

For five days, we are asking our volunteers to come and help us search out people of peace, and the only way to find people of peace is to try to share Christ with people. We will prayer-walk, and we will let you have a lot of freedom in how you can engage people (sports, going in shops, door to door with free materials, giving out things in the subway, getting henna for your hands, etc.). We will engage people, learn about them, offer to pray for them, and then seek to share the gospel with them. The goal is to find people that the Holy Spirit has been at work in, share Christ with them, and then ask them if you can meet together again with their family/friends to share more. We hope to form some groups of people studying about Jesus together as a result of our Sifting Weeks.

Where are we going?

To New York City.

Why are we involved in this short term mission trip with Global Gates?

Global Gates desire is to target the unreached people groups of the world that have made their way to NY. Our role in partnering with them is one of "sifting." Sifting is the process where we engage the unreached people of NY and sift to see if anyone is interested in Jesus Christ. Upon finding a "man/woman of peace," we use Global Gates network of trained, born-again locals to follow up with that contact for further ministry.

We believe at FCBC, Global Gates strategically engages two of our values in mission. First, Global Gates targets the unreached people groups living in NY. Second, Global Gates has a conviction that we are to make "disciples" by pairing people up with local born-again Christians to see those interested grow in Christ.

Who can go on this short term mission trip?

- A born-again believer who can demonstrate an understanding of the gospel and share their personal conversion story.
- Flexible to serve rather than being served
- Willing to sacrifice personal comforts
- Willing to submit to leadership

How can we prepare for this trip?

Everyone who participates in a Sifting Week project **MUST** complete the required pre-trip training modules. These are designed to be covered in 4 meetings, with times to practice what you are learning.

We, the members of Faith Community Bible Church Short-Term Missions Team, believing that God has called us together to serve, agree together concerning the following:

I. Our Vision

We desire to be a team of people characterized by Christ like behavior exhibited through unconditional love; unselfish, joyful service, and unified teamwork. Our ultimate purpose as a team is to spread a passion for the make disciples of all nations for all people through Jesus Christ.

II. Our Team Objectives

We believe that we can fulfill this vision through the following commitments:

- A. <u>Glorifying God</u>: We join God the Father in magnifying the the supremacy of His glory through our Lord Jesus Christ, in the power of the Holy Spirit by treasuring all that God is, loving all whom He loves, praying for all His purposes, meditating on all His Word, sustained by all His grace (Ps. 115:1-3; John 17:3, 17, 23).
- B. <u>Our Teamwork</u>: We commit ourselves to being a group of individuals who unite as one in purpose, striving to accomplish the same goal: to glorify Christ and increasing His Church (1 Cor. 12:12-31).
- C. <u>Communication</u>: We commit ourselves to resolve all inter-team conflicts according to biblical principles. This involves prayer as the first step, personal confrontation as the follow-up step and the counsel of a third party (namely, a leader) as a third and final resort (Matt. 18:15-20). In all issues of conflict, we commit ourselves to maintain a humble spirit of confidentiality, while seeking to affirm one another in love (Eph. 4:29; Col. 4:6).
- D. <u>Forgiveness</u>: We commit ourselves to the recognition of sin as our common enemy so that we each may be sensitive to our human failings and forgive each other (Eph. 6:12; Col. 3:12-13). we recognize that forgiveness is manifested through an understanding, forgetful attitude and the continuation of demonstrated love. In accordance with Hebrews 12:15, we commit ourselves to resolving any bitterness, because we realize that bitterness will drag the whole team down (Matt. 18:21-35).
- E. <u>Spiritual Growth</u>: We commit ourselves to personal worship and fellowship with God through obedience to the Lordship of Jesus Christ and an openness to learn from God's Spirit in all situations. We agree to have the same attitude of the Apostle Paul with the respect of failure (Philippians 3:12-14), and with respect to perseverance (1 Cor. 9:24-27); we will strive to put off the old self (Eph. 4:17-22) and put on the new self (Eph. 4:23-32).

These team meetings shall include team devotions, team prayer, time for communication of details and plans, and time for individual relational development (Heb. 10:24; Eph. 5:19-20).
- B. <u>Personal Quiet Times</u>: We will attempt to be faithful in our daily times with God because we believe that growing individually is essential to growing as a team (Heb. 10:22).
- C. <u>Ministry Opportunities</u>: we will seek to be a witness of the love of Jesus to the people we encounter throughout our trip.
- D. <u>Work</u>: We recognize that, if our objectives are to be completed, we must all commit ourselves to work to the best of his/her God-given ability every day of the project (1 10:31).
- E. <u>Prayer</u>: We commit ourselves to daily prayer, every day up to and including our time on the field, for the individuals on our team, the Henderson Settlement para-church ministry.
- F. <u>Leadership</u>: In situations of team concerns, the team leader will be the guide. We also recognize that working with the team is an opportunity for us all to develop God-given leadership ability, and we commit ourselves to that end though the pursuing of individual growth opportunities that may arise (Eph. 5:21; Heb. 13:17).
- G. <u>Lifestyle</u>: We will strive (God helping us) to be imitators of Christ (1 Cor. 11:1), to walk as He would walk (1 Pet. 2:21), not causing our brother to stumble (1 Cor. 8:9-13), acting in a manner appropriate to the host, doing all for the glory of God (1 Cor. 10:31).

HOW CRITICAL ARE THE FINANCIAL DEADLINES?

The deadlines are vital. The deadlines are determined based on a major payment for transportation, housing, and mission trip deposits. Therefore, every effort must be made to make payments on time.

WHAT IF MORE MONEY COMES IN FOR ME THAN WHAT I NEED?

Throughout this ministry you will function as part of a team. Your effectiveness is determined not just from an individual standpoint, but also a team. Also, each person's ability to raise funds varies depending on who they know, how many people they know, their ability to communicate effectively, etc. Therefore, since the goal is to fund the entire team, any monies given beyond what you will need will go to support other team members who are struggling with their funds.

WHAT IF LESS MONEY COMES IN FOR ME?

Our guideline is for you to have <u>at least 50% of your support one month before departure</u>. If this does not occur, please discuss this with mission project leaders, and you will be given <u>the option of paying</u> the difference or postponing your involvement.

IS IT ACCEPTABLE TO PAY YOUR OWN WAY IF YOU HAVE SUFFICIENT FUNDS?

Every aspect of our short term mission trip is designed to encourage team members in their relationship with God and to give them practical experience in what it is like to be a missionary. This includes even how the project is funded! Even if team member(s) can afford to pay for the entire trip themselves, they should cover no more than 50% of their own support need and should send out prayer letters to raise the remaining 50%. If the other 50% needed does not come in by 1 month prior to departure, participants are welcome to pay the outstanding balance out of personal finances. However, we want to emphasize that one of the critical goals of these projects is to involve as many people as possible in missions and to help you understand what it is like to be a missionary. If you pay your own way, it eliminates 20-40 people from being involved in missions, and you have not experienced the pleasure and pain of humbly trusting God to provide beyond your ability to provide for yourself.

WHAT IS THE PROPER WAY TO EXPLAIN TO PEOPLE HOW TO GIVE MONEY TO THE MISSION TRIP?

The check can be made out to Faith Community Bible Church. Your name should NOT be noted on the check. In order to designate the money to you for the mission trip please ask the person to write "teen mission trip" in the note and have your name on the envelope in which the check is mailed.

WRITING A PRAYER AND SUPPORT LETTER

These are extremely important and effective means of informing family members and friends about your upcoming ministry. We have found that 99% of the time, that if prayer letters are sent out on schedule and at least 50 copies are mailed, all the funds will come in. Here are some guidelines for writing your letter:

- **1. Reach Out.** Please reach out to people outside of Faith Community Bible Church for your support. There will be fundraising for the mission trip that will as members of FCBC to support the entire trip.
- **2. Be Personal.** Your friends are interested in YOU! In your opening paragraph, share briefly how you were led to participate in this ministry. Even though this will probably be a typed and copied letter, try to make it sound like you. Be friendly and personal.
- **3.** Be brief, but informative. In your second paragraph, include major details about the kind of ministry you will have. Explain what you will be doing as specifically as possible.

- a. Witnessing through open air campaigning with chalk-board messages
- b. Witnessing through repairing by building an addition for this family on their mobile home.
- c. Witnessing through building rafters on mobile home.
- **4. Present your need.** Most people will want to know what you will be doing and will help in whatever way they can. Many of your friends and relatives will not be able to personally participate in a short-term mission trip, so they will be excited to help support you. But they can't help if they don't know your needs.
 - a. share your need for prayer support.
 - b. Share your need for financial assistance. Explain that this is part of your experience as a short-term missionary, to trust God for your needs. Give the estimated total you will need. Explain that this amount will be used to cover your transportation, living expenses, and mission project for your trip.
- **5. Be creative.** Use your imagination in writing and designing this letter. Art, pictures, quotes, borders, colored paper, creative writing, clip art, etc., all help make your letter more creative. Your letter should be neat, attractive, and printed clearly.
- 5. Possible wording for financial support:
- "Another way you can be involved is to help provide that financial support. Would you consider supporting me with a small donation? I have included a self-addressed envelope for you to use if you feel led to contribute. I will need to raise all my funds by (May 4th) in order to pay for the mission trip. Please make checks payable to Faith Community Bible Church and note "teen mission trip" on check as well. Whether you feel led to contribute financially, through prayer, or both, all of your support is appreciated." Check out their website at www.hendersonsettlement.org
- 6. Be on TIME! Have all letters mailed out by April 19th.
