This is the season after Pentecost in the Christian year. Having celebrated the "birthday of the church" through the giving of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, we enter the Season after Pentecost for 24 weeks, to celebrate the existence of the church and recall her mission in the world. The liturgical color for the season is green, symbolic of the church's growth and mission. The triangle and trefoil on the paraments are symbols of the Trinity, reminding us that God is revealed to us as Father, Son, and Spirit. In the center is the cross, the key symbol of the Christian faith, summarizing the life and ministry, death and resurrection, incarnation and coming in glory of Jesus the Christ.

Today is Gatekeepers Workcamp Sunday, celebrating the good work of Gatekeepers in our community this past week. In 1992, Gatekeepers Workcamp started as a partnership of Rocky Mount churches committed to providing free home repairs to elderly and disabled homeowners in our community and offering our youth an opportunity to serve their neighbors. Thirty-four years later, we can see an even greater need for cooperation across lines of age, denomination, race, economic status, and ideology. We believe that seeking unity within the Body of Christ and forming partnerships with others are vital for a thriving community. This year's Gatekeepers theme has helped us to explore biblical themes of unity, cooperation, and offering our gifts as many members of the one Body, knowing that WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER.




