This is the season after Pentecost in the Christian year. Having celebrated the "birthday of the church" through the giving of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, we enter the Season after Pentecost for 24 weeks, to celebrate the existence of the church and recall her mission in the world. The liturgical color for the season is green, symbolic of the church's growth and mission. The triangle and trefoil on the paraments are symbols of the Trinity, reminding us that God is revealed to us as Father, Son, and Spirit. In the center is the cross, the key symbol of the Christian faith, summarizing the life and ministry, death and resurrection, incarnation and coming in glory of Jesus the Christ. The Acolyte brings light to the altar as a reminder of Christ, the Light of life, and leads us out of the sanctuary as a reminder that we are to take this light to the world.

Our three-week sermon series is "Help, Thanks, Wow," inspired by Anne Lamott's book of the same title. We are learning to pray the psalms together in these weeks, as we hear these simple prayers: "Help, Thanks, Wow," repeated in the Bible's prayer book. For Week Three, we will reflect on the Psalms of Praise as we learn how to pray: Wow. Each week, you will be invited to write your own psalm, which can guide your prayer life during the week to come.

If you have a young child who becomes restless during worship, you are welcome to utilize our Kids' Corner in the back of the sanctuary by the audio booth. Bibles and several large print hymnals are available for your convenience and are located in the Prayer Room off the Narthex. Please ask an usher as you enter the sanctuary. Wireless hearing aides are available in the Prayer Room off the narthex. Please ask an usher to assist you with a set. You may return the hearing aid to the Prayer Room following worship. We are grateful for our choral scholars, Jackson Baldwin, Sammie Kunz, Esther Keller, Allison Benoit, and Jacob McCain, who enrich our music ministry in many ways.
