This is the season after Pentecost in the Christian year. Having celebrated the "birthday of the church" through the giving of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost, we enter the Season after Pentecost for 24 weeks, to celebrate the existence of the church and recall her mission in the world. The liturgical color for the season is green, symbolic of the church's growth and mission. The triangle and trefoil on the paraments are symbols of the Trinity, reminding us that God is revealed to us as Father, Son, and Spirit. In the center is the cross, the key symbol of the Christian faith, summarizing the life and ministry, death and resurrection, incarnation and coming in glory of Jesus the Christ.

Building Toward God's Vision: A Stewardship Sermon Series. Throughout this stewardship season, we will hear the call of the Hebrew prophets, urging us to consider our response to the mighty acts of God in history and through God's people for generations. As we Build Toward God's Vision, we find a call to use our talents, time, and energy, as well as our financial resources, to participate in God's transformative work.

We welcome Mr. Ted Gossett as our guest organist this morning. Mr. Gossett studied music at East Carolina University, the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester. Mr. Gossett served as Lakeside's organist and choir director from 1971 to 1980.
