2024 OFFERING ENVELOPES

We are changing how we distribute offering envelopes since we all give in a variety of ways. Unless you use envelopes each week for your offering, you will not receive a box of envelopes for next year. Instead, you will receive the number of envelopes you tend to use. For example, someone who donates monthly will receive 15 envelopes. Someone who gives quarterly will receive seven. Those who no longer use envelopes will not receive any. This change will result in significant savings to the church. Your new envelopes are available in the narthex. Please pick them up as soon as possible.
