Dear Friends,

Just a few weeks shy of twenty-five years ago, you welcomed Deborah, Robert, Catherine and me to Lakeside. I will never forget the room-wide banner, covered with children's artwork, that proclaimed your welcome. I will never forget the musical treat of the ladies' quartet celebrating "Getting to Know You." And I will never forget how my face ached (in a good way) all the way home from several hours of smiles and laughter. And that was just the beginning of our relationship!

For twenty-five years (can you believe that much time has passed?) we have grown to know each other well. You have learned my strong and weak points, my gifts and insufficiencies, my hopes and my fears. We have come to love each other in that blessed way I think God intends for his people to love each other—with compassion, with patience, with correction when needed, and with gratitude.

There are so many things for which I am grateful—above all your inclusion of our family into your family. We have been at home here—and finding home is a precious thing at any point in life. I am blessed to be your pastor and your friend. Deborah and I and our larger family are deeply grateful to be a part of you.

Over the years, I have appreciated that you have included me in the various transitions of your lives: births, baptisms, graduations, weddings, retirements, and deaths. Those are holy moments and I am grateful to share them with you.

Now, I invite you to share with me and my family, a transition of our own. I have decided that the time is right for my retirement. I have been involved in ministry for over forty years, thirty-eight of those as a full-time minister. I love what I do. I love being with you and being church with you. Yet, I realize that it is time for me to do some things that I have not been able to do, especially to spend more time with family and friends.

This decision has unfolded over time. I have talked it over with our leadership and I met with our Deacons last week. My retirement will not be immediate. I intend to continue as your Pastor through January of next year. That will enable us to begin the implementation of our strategies for Growing Together Toward a Bright Future. A plan is being developed so that a Search Committee can be selected and a process implemented for them to begin their work. I expect for the next nine months to be filled with all of the good things that we do as a family of faith as well as exploring what yet lies ahead for Lakeside. I am not simply hopeful about the future of our congregation—I am confident of it!

May God's blessing be upon us all as it has been and is promised to be.
