Pastor's Page - Are You Grateful for Your Rescue?

I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel I preached is not of human origin. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ.

Galatians 1:11-12

The Apostle Paul has one of the most dramatic and famous testimonies in all of Scripture. He shares his story with us through the letters that he wrote to people he loved. As he is instructing and encouraging the churches, he frequently reminds them of where he came from and how strongly he opposed those who sought to follow Jesus. Paul never lost his sense of wonder and gratitude that God would show up for him and redeem him from the mess he created. In the first chapter of Galatians, Paul explains that after his conversion he went into Arabia and then to Damascus. I believe that he went there to invest personal time in comprehending what this God encounter meant for his soul and how this truth would completely recalibrate every facet of his life.

The church in Galatia was wandering from the faith in a serious way. Paul begins the letter with this line in verse 6, "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting the one who called you to live in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel – which is really no gospel at all." The Gospel is the Good News that Jesus has paid the penalty for our sins on the cross. We are always looking for other ways to justify ourselves, and this is what was happening here. While we don't know the whole story, we know that this church was exchanging obedience fueled by the free grace of God with disobedience masquerading as goodness. This is the struggle that followers of Christ have in every generation. Where are the forces of culture pushing us to compromise the gospel in a way that allows disobedience to masquerade as goodness? Are we purchasing too many things? Are we misusing our time? Are we giving permission for the next generation to live in a way that is contrary to the Scripture and harmful to their own souls? Are we holding grudges and withholding forgiveness?

God desires all of our lives to be transformed by him and for him. All of us are flawed and sinful by nature but by the grace of God are brought near to him by faith and practice. Our faith must al-

ways be something that we do. Faith is not just in our mind or even beautiful feelings in our heart. Any authentic faith flows out of our hearts and impacts everything we do from within our families and out into the world.

Our lives are to be forever guided by the very heart of Jesus. Our closeness with Him and His Word is the pathway for our obedience. Our Lord is the most trustworthy being in the universe and living in dependency upon him is the definition of freedom and joy. This faith is not something that anyone made up. It is the very truth of God.

May the Lord give you many end of summer blessings,


MILITARY BIBLESTICKS
