

LESSON SNAPSHOT

BOTTOM LINE:

Just a little faith can lead to big things.

OBJECTIVE:

Kids will learn that when we put our trust in God, he can turn a little faith into something great.

KEY PASSAGE:

Matthew 13:31-34, The Stories of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast

MEMORY VERSE:

"Lord, show me your ways. Teach me how to follow you." Psalm 25:4 (NIrV)

SUMMARY:

A pumpkin seed is huge compared to the tiny mustard seed, but even a mustard seed grows into something large and beautiful.

SIMPLE PRAYER:

Dear God,

Give us the faith to do great things for You.



MEMORY VERSE

LARGE GROUP:

See which group can recite the memory verse from memory the loudest - the boys or the girls.

SMALL GROUP:

Read the verse in a normal speed with the kids. Then read it super slow. Then read it super fast!

THE NOT SO CREEPY TALE OF THE PUMPKIN SEED

ITEMS NEEDED:

A cape and old fashioned suit for the Count A lab coat for Maureen A storybook

CHARACTER BREAKDOWN:

1M, 1F

CHARACTERS:

Count Pumpkin - A not at all spooky storyteller Maureen Igor - The Count's sarcastic sidekick

The Count and Maureen enter.

COUNT: Hello children. Welcome to Creepy Tales with Count Pumpkin. I am Count Pumpkin. And this is my assistant, Igor!

MAUREEN: That's Maureen Igor, thank you. Not that anyone cares.

COUNT: Every week, I will be telling you a chilling, terrifying tale guaranteed to give you—

MAUREEN: To give you a new understanding of how to follow God.

COUNT: I was going to say goosebumps.

MAUREEN: Ha! I'd like to see that happen!

COUNT: Hand me the book, Igor.

MAUREEN: You can't say Miss Igor, Count?

COUNT: Today's creepy tale is... The Monster Seed!

MAUREEN: No it's not. That says Mustard Seed! Big difference.



COUNT: Once upon a time, a farmer found a monster seed.

MAUREEN: He means mustard seed.

COUNT: The monster seed was very, very tiny.

MAUREEN: Yes, Count. MUSTARD seeds are very tiny.

COUNT: The farmer thought, "What could possibly grow from this teeny, tiny monster seed?"

MAUREEN: Not monsters, because it's not a monster seed. It's a MUSTARD seed!

COUNT: He planted the monster seed, and what do you think happened? It grew into a great big monster plant! Muah ha ha!

MAUREEN: Okay, I'm going to stop you there. Yes it was great and big, and you know what? It kind of was monstrous in size. But it wasn't actually a monster plant because it was a mustard plant grown from a tiny mustard seed.

COUNT: And you don't find that frightening?

MAUREEN: No, I find it inspiring. Jesus said that just a little faith can go a long way, just as a tiny mustard seed can grow into a "monster" of a plant. If I have even a little faith, I can do great big things for Jesus.

COUNT: Well, I suppose that's one way to look at the story. Fine. So you are not scared. Next week I will be back with an even creepier tale on... Creepy Tales with Count Pumpkin.

Count Pumpkin exits.

MAUREEN: You want to know a secret? The Count hates mustard. He's actually kind of afraid of it. So I guess for him, this was a creepy tale, right?



OBJECT LESSON OR KIDS SERMON

ITEMS NEEDED:

Pumpkin seeds

Have you ever grown pumpkins from seeds? Pumpkin seeds are very small and lightweight, and you can start a pumpkin plant in a tiny cup of dirt. But it can't stay in that cup very long. Pumpkin vines grow and spread on the ground, producing pumpkins that weight on average between 12 and 18 pounds. Amazing to think all that can come from these small seeds.

Just as a small seed can grow into a giant vine or a tree, a little faith can go a long way. It only takes a small amount of faith to do great things for God, and the more we invest that faith in God, the greater it will grow. Let's ask God to grow our faith. Let's ask Him to use us to do great things in our lives. You'll be amazed what God can do with just a little bit of faith.



LARGE GROUP GAME

SEED DROP

ITEMS NEEDED:

Pumpkin seeds
A plastic trick or treat pumpkin
A step stool

INSTRUCTIONS:

Choose four players for this game. Each player will take a turn standing on a stool with the pump-kin in front of them and attempt to drop ten seeds into the bucket. The player who gets the most seeds into the bucket wins.

VARIATION:

Instead of having kids drop seeds into a bucket, you could have them launch seeds at a bucket a short distance away with a plastic spoon.

WHAT'S THE POINT?

Just a tiny seed of faith is enough for God to do great things in our lives.



LARGE GROUP LESSON

BOTTOM LINE:

Just a little faith can lead to big things.

OBJECTIVE:

Kids will learn that when we put our trust in God, he can turn a little faith into something great.

KEY PASSAGE:

Matthew 13:31-34, The Stories of the Mustard Seed and the Yeast

INTRO:

When you go to visit the pumpkin patch – or the bin at your grocery store – you see the finished result of months of hard work by a farmer. We see the fruit of their labor – literally – in the form of big, orange, fully grown pumpkins. We don't see the hard work that went into growing the pumpkin. We don't see the vines that nurtured them or the sprinklers that watered them along the way.

That said, we only need to crack the pumpkin open to see where it came from. Like every other plant in the world, the pumpkins we enjoy this time of year started with seeds. For many people, the seeds are the best part. Cleaned and roasted and salted, pumpkin seeds make for a delicious snack. But if we were to plant those seeds in good soil, keep them watered and give them lots of sunshine, we would see how these pumpkins came to be. We would watch those not-so-tiny pumpkin seeds sprout, grow into vines, flower, and grow pumpkins, right in our own backyard.

Every plant, great or small, has the similar beginning of life. One of the tiniest of seeds is the mustard seed, a seed so small it's only two or three millimeters in diameter. Yet a mustard plant can grow to be anywhere from six to twenty feet tall. In some circumstances, mustard plants have grown as big as thirty feet! Hard to believe something so big could start as something so tiny.

It's no coincidence Jesus chose the mustard seed to talk about faith. Jesus wanted us to know that even a small amount of faith in God can lead to big things. He wants us to trust God with our lives, and if we do, He will nurture that faith and grow it into something very big.

READ MATTHEW 13:31-34

LARGE GROUP LESSON

MAIN POINT:

A tiny mustard seed doesn't stay tiny for long. Given the right circumstances, it grows from a tiny spec into a giant tree, big enough to offer shelter to nesting birds. If this is what God can do with the tiny mustard seed, imagine what He can do with our lives.

Jesus isn't asking us to take a huge leap of faith. Not at first. He says give me just a little. Trust me with a little, and see what I can do. The more we trust Him, the more our faith will grow as God do-es His work in our lives. Our faith may start like a tiny seed, but like the mustard plant, God will nurture it into something big!

DRIVE IT HOME:

Jesus uses two things to describe how our faith grows. He talks about the mustard seed, and He talks about yeast. Yeast is a tiny microorganism. It is mixed with warm water and then mixed into flour and other ingredients to make dough that is used to make things like bread and pizza crust. It's that tiny yeast that makes a small lump of dough rise into a larger ball of dough.

The mustard seed teaches us that our faith will grow as we trust God more and more. The yeast tells us that faith will fill every part of us. The more we spend time cultivating our relationship with God, the more we will love Him and give all of our selves to Him.

Every time we step out on faith and God proves faithful, our faith will grow. It will not stay a tiny seed but grow into a giant plant. Our faith will become a part of every decision we make – at church, at home, at school, at play. From that tiny seed of faith, God will build us into followers of Christ who boldly share what we believe and love others so that the world can see Jesus in our lives. We can plant mustard seeds in the hearts of our friends so that they, too, can have a faith that grows and matures like our own.

A little mustard seed grows into a giant plant. A little yeast yields a large ball of dough. A little faith can make a big difference in our life and everyone around us. Give Jesus just a little faith, and you'll be amazed how fast and how big it will grow!

CLOSE WITH A SIMPLE PRAYER:

Dear Jesus,

Give us the faith to do great things for You.



SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION (K-2ND)

ICEBREAKER:

What's your favorite fun size candy bar?

MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITY:

Psalm 25:4

Have the kids recite this week's verse. Then test them - and ask who can recite the memory verse from the previous series you just finished a few weeks ago!

SMALL GROUP GAME/ACTIVITY:

SMALL GROUP GAME/ACTIVITY:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:



What you need to know:


