A Voter's Meeting is set for Sept. 20 at 9:30 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. The meeting will be in-person only – and won't be available online. The purpose of the meeting is based on the following statement of intent. "For Trinity Lutheran Church School to hire the Generis Partners, LLC (Generis) to provide consulting services to Trinity for the purpose of cultivating generosity. The initiative will culminate no later than Spring of 2022. The cost will not exceed \$56,000."

Trinity Lutheran is putting the finishing touches on the upcoming school year, which begins on Tuesday, Sept. 8.
