Through Stained Glass: Advent Belonging

ad vent ('ad vent/)

means: coming or arrival mantra: "Come, Lord Jesus"

Advent begins on Sunday, December 3. We will remember we belong to hope, peace, joy, and love for four weeks. As Christians, Advent is the season we remember the story of the Divine Face of Love incarnating in the person Jesus of Nazareth.

Advent is about the incarnation. It is about redemption. It is about the Divine saying it is good to be human – to be made of the Earth. The Franciscans say the Incarnation was already the Redemption; that is to say, in Jesus of Nazareth, we see God's 'Yes' enfleshed.

Advent is about the Christ. Christ isn't Jesus' last name. Christ is God's love – the life force behind all that is and will be. Remember, when we speak of Advent or preparing for Christmas, we're not just talking about waiting for the baby Jesus to be born. That already happened 2,000 years ago. We're welcoming the Universal Christ, the Cosmic Christ, the Christ that is forever born in the human soul and history.

means: be a member or part of (a particular group, organization, or class) mantra: In Christ, through Christ, with Christ – I, We, Belong

Everything belongs. All things have a place. We are a part of a great love story. The first revelation of the Creator's love – or the first incarnation – is creation itself. All of matter – the stuff of stars – is the hiding place for the Spirit. Thus, it is the Body of God.

Since the very beginning of time, God's Spirit has revealed its glory and goodness through the physical creation. We are waiting and preparing, creating room and opening our hearts to the arrival of Love. Once in the infant Jesus, now in the oneness we share with God.

The second incarnation – the presence of God poured into the person of Jesus – came from the first. If everything belongs to God, then Jesus didn't come *into* the world, but Jesus came *out* of an already Christ-soaked world. The One for whom we wait revealed to us a oneness, an intimacy with God that draws us into the fullness of communion and connection.

Advent is about belonging. The stories we read during this season reveal to us the longing of God – to be in relationship with Their creation. Advent pulls back the curtain on the myth that God is absent from the world. Into this world, the Christ is birthed again and again – whenever there is justice and wherever peace occurs. We participate in this birthing – we are the midwives of another world being possible – where every creature knows of their belonging!

In Advent, we hear the good news that Christ is born. Not just then but now. In the Incarnation, everything belongs. Everything is connected. Advent is a season we remember we aren't apart from God but are a part of the divine Body of Christ. Thus, not all is lost – there is hope. Peace is found in the path of descension, a letting go to allow God in. At that place, the threshold of our going and God's coming is where we find our joy. And all of it – everything – belongs.

All of us on the Ministry of the Hands team would like to thank members of the congregation for their support, presence and contributions to help further our mission of service to the community in 2023. It has been a busy year, and we are blessed and grateful for the opportunity to do our work. We wish you and your families an Advent and Christmas season full of hope, joy, peace, and love.

In November, we voted to make the following contributions to our community partners: \$500 to Kemmerer Village to purchase gift cards for residents; \$1,000 to the

Logan County Food Pantry; and \$1,000 to the Central Illinois Veterans Commission for the Regional Supportive Housing Project at the former St. Clara's facility. We also committed to purchasing additional snacks for the Center for Creativity and Community which now has attendance of between 20 and 25 students on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We would like to highlight the impact the Center has had on these students—and on the adults who help each day. This is exactly what we mean when we say that we want our missional work to be relational! The success of the Center means we need more adult help, and our team encourages you to join us—just talk to Adam if you are available. This is truly meaningful community work and individually rewarding for students and volunteers.

The year is not over, and December is busy, too. We are once again collecting donations for Kemmerer Village gift cards. Checks should be made to Debbie Schweitzer and given to her before December 2. The annual Holiday Shopping Project for children at Head Start and Christian Child Care will take place on December 12. This year, we have 95 children! A total of 67 children from Head Start will come to shop; we will also prepare gift bags for them and for 28 children at Christian Child Care. We need lots of volunteers for this project, and there is a sign-up sheet in the Parlor. This is a really fun day full of joy and laughter.

Looking ahead to 2024, our team will focus on expanding the visibility of our critical community partners. We will be highlighting an organization monthly in the Link, producing bulletin inserts, inviting representatives to speak to us, posting their stories on our Facebook page and/or reposting their announcements, among other possibilities. In addition to community partners, we would also highlight the *Summer Food Program*, *Food for Thought* and other projects the church undertakes. Highlights from the November Session Meeting

The Session met on November 14 with all eight members present.

The projected 2024 budget presented by the Ministry of Resources included expenses that exceeded income. Session spent considerable time examining the proposed budget and seeking to balance it. The Session could not close the gap despite reducing approximately 75% of the difference between expenses and revenue. Therefore, the Session could not adopt a budget for 2024 at the meeting. The Ministry of Resources will continue to seek a balanced budget, and Session expects to meet again in December to consider the issue. The Session approved a motion from the Ministry of Resources to hire Lindy Manuel to fill the position of Administrative Assistant effective Nov. 27, contingent on her passing the required background checks.
