

An immediate change you will notice is a rebranding of the name to simply "Friendship Circle Preschool". This more accurately reflects the educational programs Crystal has implemented for all ages.

If you have an item you would like the Council to discuss, please notify the church office at least one week before our meeting. If you would like to attend a meeting, please join us on the second Monday of each month in the Fellowship Hall at 5:30 pm.
