

#### "The GPS Is Set"

#### I can hardly make it anywhere without my GPS.

I'm part of that last generation who remembers printing off directions from **MapQuest** before a family road trip. Now, all I have to do is type it into my phone—and like magic, it pops up on the car screen.

My wife, Brittany, teases me about it all the time. She says I can barely find my way out of a parking lot. (She's not wrong.) Even though I'm learning my way around **West Plains**, I still rely on those directions to keep me from getting lost.

Without them, I wander.

#### **★** Wandering Without Direction

In Scripture, we see that same kind of wandering.

- The **Israelites** spent 40 years in the wilderness, aimless until God gave them a path forward.
- God's people were stuck in exile in Egypt for 400 years—until He led them home.

Like them, when we don't have direction, we drift.

So we ask:

What is our purpose? How do we live it out? How do we know when we're on the right path—or when we've missed it?

#### **†** Finding Our Purpose

The good news is that God doesn't leave His people without direction. Jesus gave us a clear mission:

"Go into all the world and make disciples..."

Or in the words of our United Methodist mission statement: "To make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world."

That's our GPS.

That's the direction that keeps us moving with purpose.

#### 2. Kids Classes



There are several speaking parts for our school age friends and support roles for our preschool friends. Nativity Services are great for sharing the story of Jesus with our community. We will need a few adults to assist Crystal with the Nativity play. We need a person to play a few songs, several people to help with managing children during the performance, and several people to serve refreshments at the end of the performance. Children Advent Class will begin Tuesday, December 2nd. Children will take an Advent Adventure to see what it was like to anticipate the arrival of the most important person in the history of the world. #### Greetings Church Family,

Friendship Circle Ministries has been a Major ministry of our church for over 50 years. This ministry began as a preschool for 3 and 4 year olds but over the years, our program expanded to serve families in need of daily childcare. Currently up to 54 children are enrolled in these programs.

Many families have had two generations attended Fiendship Circle Preschool, where they have learned to love Jesus, and have continued to grow in their faith and have become committed followers of Jesus to become strong leaders in their faith, to the extent of considering ordained ministry.

In past years this ministry has been able to maintain itself through the tuition paid by the families whose children have attended Friendship Circle. Over the past few years, funding of Friendship Circle ministries has become more difficult. Several years ago, the public schools began offering free preschool for four-year-old children. While this has been a tremendous benefit for children in our community, it has made a significant impact on the 4-year-old Friendship Circle enrolment. State and Federal grants are available to help private childcare facilities, however since we are a United Methodist Church we are not eligible for those grants.

Funding Friendship Ministries will become more of a challenge in 2026 when minimum wage increases to \$15.00/ hour. While all of our staff are worth much more than this, the increased cost of staffing will add strain to our existing budget. In an effort to explore our options for maintaining the outstanding Friendship Circle ministries, Pastor Sean has reached out to the Conference office to request a consultant for review of our program. This consultant visited our church in October, and we are anticipating a report of her findings & recommendations in the next couple weeks. Please keep this situation in prayer as we move forward with this disciple making program.

Mark your calendars to attend the annual Charge Conference on November 9 at 3:00 p.m in Fellowship Hall (please note the change in location). The Charge Conference is the annual business meeting for the local churches. Come and join us as our District Superintendent, Jon Thompson, will moderate this time together.

As always, your Church Council meetings are open to all who are interested. If you have an item you would like the Council to discuss, please notify the church office at least one week before our meeting. If you would like to attend a meeting, please join us on the second Monday of each month in the Fellowship Hall at 5:30 pm. We remain a church family whose desire is to "Make Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World.
