#### Honoring CTK's Piano Man


"O sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth." Psalm 96:1

#### Pray for God's Presence

Have you ever considered what it was like to be one of Jesus' disciples? To sit at his side and learn, not only about prayer, but about all things? The 12 disciples were changed dramatically as they spent time with Jesus, who was sometimes called "Emmanuel," which means "God is with us." [Matthew 1:23 NRSV]. Peter, for example, was a rugged fisherman, but after three years with Jesus became an articulate spokesperson for the early church. Jesus didn't have to say a word—it was enough for Peter to just sit in his presence. We naturally become more like whomever we spend time with.

Two thousand years later, it is still possible for us to sit in God's presence, and doing so will change us, as it did Peter. How do we begin? We can simply pray and ask the Holy Spirit to come and meet us face-to-face. Jesus promised that if we ask we will receive [Matthew 7:7], and that our heavenly Father will give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him [Luke 11:13]. Activate your faith and choose to believe that when you ask, he will come. When he comes, take time to wait in his presence, to meditate on his goodness and to thank him for all his benefits.

What are his benefits? The Bible says that God "gives to mortals life and breath and ALL THINGS." [Acts 17:25; see also Romans 11:36]. Everything we need is found in the presence of God. Do you need healing? You will find it in God's presence because he is the healer. [Exodus 15:26]. Are you lonely? God is the comforter. [Psalm 23:4]. Do you lack provisions? God will provide. [Exodus 16:4; Luke 9:12-17]. Are you lost? Jesus is the way, the truth and the life. [John 14:6]. Have you lost your joy? In God's presence there is "fullness of joy." [Psalm 16:11]. There is also protection in God's presence, as he reminds us: "do not fear for I am with you, do not be afraid, for I am your God." [Isaiah 41:10]. The more time we spend in God's presence, the more aware we become of God's goodness.

Brother Lawrence (born Nicholas Herman) was a Carmelite friar in 17th century France, who learned to practice the presence of God in his daily life. His letters and other teachings have been collected into a short book entitled "The Practice of the Presence of God", which is now freely available <u>here</u> in the public domain. Brother Lawrence believed that our only business in this life is to "love and delight ourselves in God," and so he trained himself to focus on God's presence in whatever he did, including his monastery kitchen chores. He taught that one needs "neither art nor science for going to God, but only a heart resolutely determined to apply itself to nothing but Him, or for His sake, and to love Him only." Brother Lawrence astutely questioned, "How can we pray to Him without being with Him?"

"Come," my heart says, "seek his face!" Your face, Lord, do I seek. ~Psalm 27:8

Behold the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. ~Revelation 21:3

In addition, WELCOME Team volunteers provide at-home tutoring. Their progress is astounding! Randy has attended summer school with his friends. He even had the opportunity to attend Vacation Bible School.

All of this has been made possible because of YOU. The success of the collaboration of these five congregations is amazing. Seven months ago, you opened your hearts to a family with dire need. Thanks to your many donations, we worked together to provide an entire household of necessities in record time. The financial contributions help the family with the costs of rent and utilities on an ongoing basis. Volunteers from each of the churches provide transportation, navigation of the medical system, provide tutoring, acquire legal advice, monitor financial need, communicate with the Synod, and plan fundraising opportunities. In essence, we are their extended family. All made possible by you. "God's Work, Our Hands."

The newest development made possible by your financial contributions is a big step. Specialized legal representation has been retained. Ariac and Andrea are being guided through the process of applying for asylum. Once the applications have been submitted, they are able to apply for green cards that enable them to become employed. The entire process will take a few years at best. There are no guarantees of success, but we will remain prayerfully hopeful. We give thanks for the opportunity to serve together.
