PRAYER CORNER

SANCTUS – HOLY, HOLY, HOLY!

The Lutheran liturgy is rich in themes of prayer and praise that can easily be incorporated into our individual prayer practices. This month we continue our study by examining the "Sanctus," which is part of the liturgy of Holy Communion, or the Eucharist, or what the Evangelical Lutheran Worship book ["ELW"] calls the "Meal":

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest. Hosanna in the highest.

[See ELW pp. 108, 130]. As with most of the liturgy, these words are taken directly from the Bible: Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory. ~ Isaiah 6:3

Holy, holy, the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come. ~ Revelation 4:8

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. ~ Psalm 118:26

The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" ~ Matthew 21:9

The Latin word "Sanctus" means holy or sacred. This part of the worship service provides us with a glimpse of heaven, and the God of heaven. This is the eternal song of the angels who hover around the throne room of God, declaring his holiness. So powerful is their song that the very foundations of heaven tremble at it. As we join in this song, we, too, declare God's holiness and glory.

Also, as we sing these words just prior to receiving the Meal, we recognize and bless Jesus who comes to us yet again, just as he came to the adoring throngs who first greeted him with "Hosanna!" In the Sanctus, we confess the reality that Jesus is present with us as we receive his body and blood. There is nothing in this entire world that compares to the miracle of Jesus coming to feed his people. In this Meal, God breaks into our world to give us life, health, hope and forgiveness. In anticipation, our repeated cry is "Hosanna in the highest," for what is more needed in this dying world than these?1

This month, spend time meditating on the holiness of God, and on the words of the Sanctus. God's presence comes to us not only in the Meal, but anytime we declare his holiness and worship his glory.

Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty!
Early in the morning our song shall rise to thee.
Holy, Holy, Holy! merciful and mighty!
God in three persons, blessed Trinity!

Luther Glen Farm showed our youth the meaning of nature, service, and rest:

Monday, we learned about finding meaning in Nature. We conducted a Bible study outside and intentionally observed different aspects of nature around us. Making observations that helped us profoundly connect to nature.

Tuesday's focus was on finding meaning in service. This group of young people transformed the farm with their work. In California, there are two planting seasons. One group weeded, tilled, and replanted all the gardens, helping to provide food for future campers. Another group moved heavy materials, such as bags of concrete, to the areas of the farm where they were needed. Others cut and trimmed trees around the farm. As a whole group, they all help move a very heavy chicken coup so the chickens will have a larger area to forage freely, and they weeded an entire hill, clearing the way for future projects.

On Wednesday, after a day of hard work, these youths woke up early and spent the day having fun at Disneyland. It was a memorable experience of bonding.

Thursday's focus was on finding meaning in rest. In a hustle culture, rest is often seen as a bad thing, yet we are called as people of God to take that time to refuel our minds, bodies, and spirits.

Each night was alive with worship. The camp echoed with the sounds of voices bouncing through the mountains. We even had Bishop Brenda Bos of the Southwestern California Synod give our message for worship one night.


Thank you to all who donated and supported this trip. You have contributed to a truly fantastic experience that our youth will remember and be formed by for the rest of their lives.

Youth Canoe Trip Tales of Adventure:



Five youth and three adults ventured down the Namekogen and St Croix Rivers for a 3 day/2-night canoeing adventure. Highlights of the trip included seeing the beauty of God's creation, particularly the sighting of bald eagles, turtles, deer, and many huge fish (e.g. sturgeon and muskie). We traveled 33 miles in 3 days, paddling 13 miles on the first and second day on the Namekogen. On the 3rd and final day, we paddled 7 miles, starting on the Namekogen and ending on the St Croix River, where we ventured through several rapids. The devotional themes for our trip included stories about water, including our baptism and water stories from the Bible. 




