PRAYER CORNER

DOXOLOGY, A WORD OF GLORY!

If you are Lutheran, any time is a good time to sing the Doxology! But it seems especially appropriate now, at the end of the year, as we reflect on the challenges and blessings of 2025.

“Doxology” comes from the Latin word doxologia, which in turn comes from the ancient Greek logos, meaning “word,” and doxa, meaning “glory.” Therefore, a doxology is literally a word of glory. Let’s end the year by singing a word of praise and glory to God:

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow;

*Praise him, all creatures here below;
Praise him above, ye heav’ly host;
Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost.*

[ELW #884 and #885]. This hymn was written in 1674 by Thomas Ken, an Anglican bishop and royal chaplain. These four simple lines have resounded throughout church halls and sanctuaries for more than 350 years, making it one of the most universally sung hymns in the English-speaking world. It has been said that it is “likely the single best-known verse of all Christian hymnology and poetry.”

Indeed, many people do not even need a hymnal to sing it, so ingrained it is in their minds and memories. The need to praise and worship God is universal. God made us for doxology. God made us for praise. God created a world where “*the heavens are telling the glory of God and the firmament proclaims his handiwork*” [Psalm 19:1], just as we experienced in the recent awesome display of Aurora Borealis—the Northern Lights. Jesus said that if his followers were silent, “*the very stones would cry out*” in praise to God. [Luke 19:40]. We glorify God in our heartfelt expressions of praise. The simple yet profound words of the Doxology allow us to praise and worship God, both individually and corporately, as we lift our voices to the One who deserves all our devotion.

*I will praise You, O Lord my God,
with all my heart,
And I will glorify Your name
forevermore.*


